### Robin Roberts honors Selma Blair at MS gala, calling actress 'a stunning example of strength'



Selma Blair was honored at the [Race to Erase MS](#) gala Friday night in Beverly Hills, California.

She has not only inspired countless others battling multiple sclerosis, but let her son, her friends and her family know they are her world and the reason for her strength.

Blair and her 7-year-old son Arthur both wore custom outfits for the event. She was honored with the 2019 Medal of Hope for her work raising awareness and shedding light on the disease. Blair later told those in attendance that her boy is "everything" to her.

"My dream is that I get to be a useful mom, as long as this kid wants me," she joked to the audience. "Which is about on more year," she added.

She said she was honored to "speak for so many people, who don't get a chance to speak."

Those listening were captivated by Blair's honesty and bravery, which included her "Cruel Intentions" co-star Sarah Michelle Gellar and "GMA" anchor Robin Roberts, who Blair thanked for giving her a platform on "GMA" earlier this year.

Roberts took to Instagram after the event, writing, "Ohhhh what a night, a VERY special night seeing @selmaiblair honored at the #RaceToEraseMS Gala. Her dear friend @sarahmgellar & I had the pleasure of presenting the award to Arthur's beloved mother. Selma's a stunning example of strength, courage, and determination for us all...especially to those who are also bravely facing MS."

The "GMA" anchor and inspiration herself later shared a heartwarming picture of the two embracing on the red carpet.

She also said Monday on "GMA" that it was an "honor" to be by Blair's side and that her energy at all times "is infectious."

"This year's event raised close to \$2 million," Roberts said.

Blair shared her own photos from the night, none more special than her holding her son on the carpet. The actress has been very open on social media about the ups and downs of living with MS and Friday night was a high like no other.

"This child," she wrote alongside the pic of her and her son. "He sees me at every stage. And tonight was for him in my heart. To thank him and everyone who has rooted for me and for all of us with #MS and autoimmune disease. We thank you. We thank @sarahmgellar and @robinrobertsgma and the whole team @nancypeaceandlove has assembled in the #racetoerasems."

And finally, Blair's dear friend Gellar summed it up well, calling her "the true definition of brave" on Instagram.

Shouts of “You’re amazing,” “You’re awesome” and “You’re unreal” greeted Selma Blair during her impromptu remarks from onstage at Friday’s Race to Erase MS gala.

Dealing with a recently diagnosed, aggressive form of multiple sclerosis, which appears to have caused spasms in her vocal cords, Blair at times struggled to speak but never lost her sense of humor. So when her voice became shaky, she joked, “I’m actually auditioning for Katharine Hepburn’s part in ‘On Golden Pond.’”

The 26th fundraiser honored Blair for her courage and the Hausman Family Foundation for its generous support. The lively shindig, which was at the Beverly Hilton Hotel, featured a fashion show by Alice and Olivia by Stacey Bendet and upbeat performances by Aloe Blacc and Flo Rida, who delivered a 12-song set that had everyone jumping up on their feet.

“There are a lot of things I can say about Selma Blair,” said Gellar, naming the actress’ passion, beauty and talent, before jokingly adding, “but all those things pale in comparison to her one superpower: She is without question the best kisser.” Her reference: a kissing scene they shared together in the 1999 movie, “Cruel Intentions.”

“I’m really happy,” Blair told the audience, during her turn at the podium. “I am really happy that you are all here and that I get this chance to speak for so many people who don’t get a chance to speak.”

Then turning to her 7½-year old son, Arthur Saint Bleick, she concluded, “My dream is that I get to be a useful mom — as long as this kid wants me.”

“Over 26 years ago,” Galecki said during his introduction to Davis, “her world was rocked when she received the diagnosis for this crippling disease, which would have stopped many in their tracks. ... She has but one simple request for the rest of us that we join her in the race to erase MS.”

Selma Blair had the best dates by her side at Friday's Race to Erase MS Gala in Los Angeles. The actress, who was first diagnosed with multiple sclerosis in October, was joined by pals Sarah Michelle Gellar and Robin Roberts, as well as her seven-year-old son, Arthur to the event.

Selma's mini-me twinned with mom in a blue blazer, matching velvet pants, and white sneakers. Meanwhile, Blair opted for a navy two-piece tuxedo by Christian Siriano and a cane — which she first made a red carpet staple at the Oscars after-party.

The star was practically beaming while posing next to her son, offsetting her dark ruby lip with glowing skin and rosy cheeks. She styled her chin-length bob in classic curls and swept to one side.



Inside the event, Selma gave a heartfelt speech about her battle with MS and how she continues to fight to be a good mom to Arthur amid the disease. As she took the stage with her son, Blair admitted: "I have to say that I am afraid that I will fall, and I have the best fall-bearers in the world with Robin and Sarah and my son, Arthur."



"I am really happy. I am really happy that you are all here. That I get this chance to speak for so many people who don't get a chance to speak -- and oh my god, can you hear? I am talking really well," she said, before thanking Gellar and the event's co-founder Nancy Davis for their unwavering support.

"I have to tell you, everything is for our future, for the people who have immune diseases. My dream is that I get to be a useful mom as long as this kid wants me," she continued while picking up Arthur and joking: "Which is about one more year."

## Selma Blair Honored at Race to Erase MS Gala Hosted by Johnny Galecki



The actress gave the evening its most emotional moment when she lifted her 8 year-old son and said, "You're the reason I have to stay healthy."

In its 26th iteration, the May 10 Race to Erase MS at the Beverly Hilton began with a massive silent

auction. Amid the boxing gloves autographed by Mike Tyson; five star hotel rooms on exotic Third World beaches and enough yoga classes to employ half the holy men in India were the usual opportunities to bid on a celebrity encounter. But there's a new twist on the process. A website called Celebrity Buzz has someone attend; they peruse the offerings, and clue their readers in on what's available. This does wonders for bumping up the prices. While the in-person guests weren't especially keen on lunch with Lisa Rinna, somewhere on the Internet a fan bid \$8,117. For a 25 minute interview with Larry King? \$10,700. And golf at the Bel-Air Country Club with Rick Hilton (and this stretches the definition of celebrity) went for \$3,225. All these bids added to the evening's final take of \$1.8 million.

The Race is the creation of Nancy Davis, who said what's currently gratifying to her is the research progress on the central nervous system disease. "What's so cool is last year there were 15 drugs that help stop the progression of MS," said Davis. "Now there're 17. It can take 10 years to get these drugs approved. That's how much research is going on."

When guests left the silent auction area for the Hilton's ballroom, the evening began immediately with an Alice + Olivia fashion show that had Tommy Hilfiger up cheering (He later bid \$25,000 to record music with Nile Rodgers at London's Abbey Road Studios.) "The good thing about these clothes is they're like \$500," said Nancy's mother Barbara Davis. "They beat out Chanel. They're better, I swear."

With *The Big Bang Theory's* Johnny Galecki acting as emcee, there were speeches by Nancy Davis; the honoring of the Hausman Family Foundation for their philanthropic work; and Selma Blair for her "bravery and strength" in dealing with MS. The actress gave the evening its most emotional moment when she lifted her 8 year-old son and said, "You're the reason I have to stay healthy."

The evening's entertainment included a dance troupe of Westside teenage girls in sequin jackets performing under the name Peace and Love. They wowed the crowd by continuing to dance even though, half-way through their highly energized act, the music cutoff. David Foster and Jack Osbourne introduced Aloe Blacc who's strong, three song set ended with Avicii's "Wake Me Up." The evening wrapped with Flo Rida, backed by what sounded like a heavy metal band, rattling the chandeliers with his 45 minute performance.

Among those on hand were LaToya Jackson, Vanna White, Byron Allen, Tia Carrere, Tommy Chong, Frances Fisher, Jimmy Jam, Kris Jenner, Avril Lavigne, Diane Warren and Dave Winfield.

## Honoree Selma Blair Keeps Her Sense of Humor at Race to Erase MS Gala



**Selma Blair** has not let her multiple sclerosis diagnosis take away her sense of humor. The actress was honored at the Race to Erase MS gala and fundraiser hosted by founder **Nancy Davis** at the Beverly Hilton on Friday night.

"I can't read a teleprompter because I have double vision, so you're stuck with unfiltered Selma," she joked as she took the stage.

Multiple sclerosis is an autoimmune disease that affects the central nervous system and causes problems with vision, balance and muscle control. Blair had suffered from symptoms for years without realizing what they actually were, and finally announced her diagnosis in October of last year. She conducted her first interview since the diagnosis with **Robin Roberts** in February, showing the world what it was like to live with MS. In the middle of a flare-up during the candid chat, she experienced spasmodic dysphonia, a disorder that caused her voice to break every few sentences. Her voice stayed steady during her speech until she brought attention to it, but quickly laughed it off.

"See now that I brought it up — seriously that's amazing. I'm actually auditioning for Katherine Hepburn's part in 'On Golden Pond,'" she said.

Blair's longtime friend and "Cruel Intentions" co-star **Sarah Michelle Gellar** helped introduce her and joined her onstage along with Roberts and Blair's son, Arthur.

"I've been friends with Selma for more than 20 years, so I thought I knew everything there is to know about her. Mostly because she has no filter. But in the last year I have seen a new side to her. Sure, she's an incredible mother and friend, but now I know how brave she is. It would've been not only easy, but understandable, for Selma to hide when she received her diagnosis. Instead she's done the exact opposite. She is facing this head on and sharing this journey with the world," Gellar said.

"And while it may not be pretty, it's real and it's selfless. I don't think there is a stronger person I know."

Not letting MS stop her from acting, Blair will appear in the upcoming Netflix drama, "Another Life," later this year. Actress **Katee Sackhoff** also noted how her co-star's sense of humor has inspired her and others on screen and off.

"Bringing people into her daily life and her struggles to be champion for MS and people living with disabilities is absolutely to be celebrated," she told *Variety*. "If we can't laugh at ourselves and have a little bit of self deprecation, life isn't worth living. You've got to be able to laugh at yourself and have fun. I've seen the smile she puts on her face daily to inspire people and that is a beautiful thing."

With Mother's Day right around the corner, Blair ended her acceptance speech with a humorous tribute to her son.

"My dream is that I get to be a useful mom as long as this kid wants me, which is about one more year," she said.

The celebratory fundraiser included a silent auction, fashion show, dance performance and mini concerts by **Aloe Blacc** and **Flo Rida**. Davis also honored the Hausman Family Foundation and **Richard Hausman**, who has lived with MS for 50 years. Celebrities **Kris Jenner**, **Johnny Galecki**, **Avril Lavigne**, **LaToya Jackson**, **Rumer Willis**, **Vanna White**, **Constance Zimmer**, **Maksim Chmerkovskiy**, **Peta Murgatroyd** and **Tommy Chong** also attended.

Blair, 46, brought along her son as her date to the 26th annual Race to Erase MS gala on Friday, where the 46-year-old actress, who was diagnosed with multiple sclerosis in October, was being honored.

While on the red carpet, the pair held hands as they posed for some adorable mother-son photos, with Blair rocking a custom Christian Siriano tuxedo with a black cane.

As she took to the stage inside the event, the proud mother shared that her son “is the reason for everything.”

“I have to say that I am afraid that I will fall, and I have the best ‘fall-bearers’ in the world,” she continued, praising her son as well as her longtime pal Sarah Michelle Gellar and Robin Roberts, both of whom also spoke at the gala.

Reflecting on the beginning of her career, which she joked happened “120 years ago,” Blair thanked her *Cruel Intentions* costar as well as the film’s director, Roger Kumble, for being her champions.

“There were much more eligible people that wanted this job, but with my will and grace, and Sarah and Roger, I got it,” she shared. “She fought for me then, and she is fighting for me now, so that is why this fight is so much easier.”

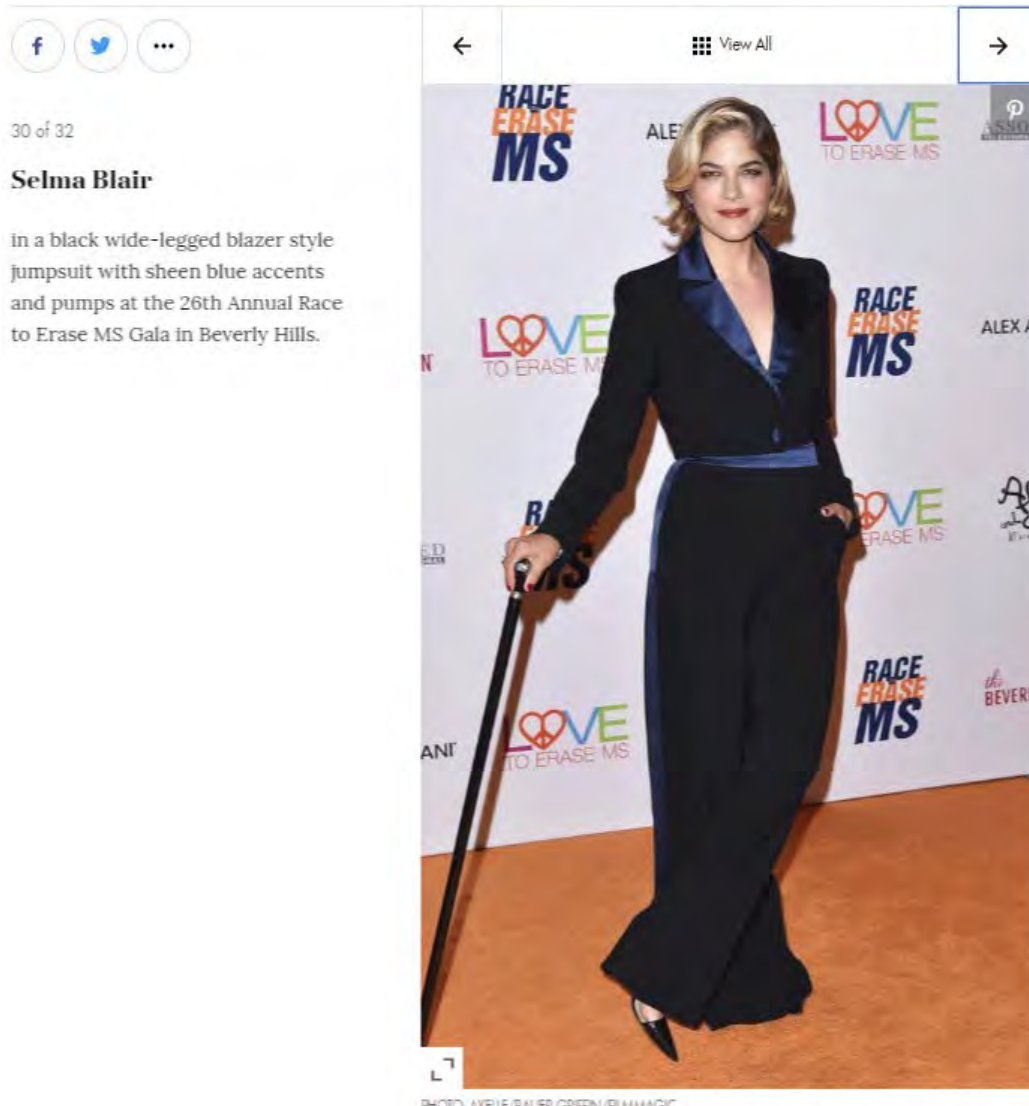

This marked the second celebrity event the 46-year-old actress has attended since she **revealed her diagnosis with multiple sclerosis**, an incurable and often disabling disease of the central nervous system, in October. She **made her first official celebrity appearance since revealing the news at Vanity Fair's 2019 Oscars after-party** in February.

At the gala, which took place at the Beverly Hilton, Blair wore a chic black Christian Siriano tuxedo pantsuit and clutched a cane as she walked the orange carpet with her 7-year-old son Arthur Saint Bleick.

"This child. **#arthursaintbleick**. He sees me

at every stage," Blair wrote on **Instagram**. "And tonight was for him in my heart. To thank him and everyone who has rooted for me and for all of us with **#MS** and autoimmune disease."

On the carpet, the actress reunited with **longtime friend and *Cruel Intentions* co-star Sarah Michelle Gellar** and Robin Roberts, **who interviewed her on *Good Morning America*** about her MS battle in February. The two later presented her with an award, and Blair's son joined them onstage.

"I won't read a teleprompter because I have double vision, so you're stuck with unfiltered Selma," Blair told the audience, as they applauded. "And I have to say I'm afraid I'll fall, but I have the best fall bearers in the world with Robin Roberts and Sarah Michelle Gellar and my son Arthur. I'm really happy. I'm really happy that you are all here. That I get this chance to speak for so many people who don't get a chance to speak at all."

"I have to say I came to this town 120 years ago and I had lots of auditions until I got a job," she said. "And I got a great job, a really great job and it was because of this woman [Gellar] right here. She fought for me and [*Cruel Intentions* director] Roger Kumble fought for me again...she fought for me then and she's fighting for me now and that's why this fight is so much easier."

Blair also thanked Roberts, "who paved the way herself with so much grit and talent and determination" and "gave me a platform to speak to other people." She also thanked **Jaime King**, "who sends me flowers every week."

Blair later wrote on **Instagram**. "Thank you **@sarahmgellar** for presenting me with the medal of hope along with my mentor of sorts **@robinrobertsgma**. **#racetoerasmsgala** 2019. What a night. Thank you **@nancypeaceandlove** for always bringing the hope and determination. And **@csliriano** for this custom tuxedo. **#everything**"

"We love her beauty and her talent, but all of those things pale in comparison to her one super power. She is without question, the best kisser," Gellar told the crowd, drawing laughs and applause.

"I've been friends with Selma for more than 20 years so I thought I knew everything there was to know about her—mostly because she has no filter," she said. "But in the last year, I have seen a new side to her. Sure, she is an incredible mother and friend, but now I know how brave she is. It would have not only been easy but understandable for someone to hide once they were diagnosed with MS, but instead she has done amazing things. She is facing this head on and sharing this journey with the world. In this day and age when nobody shares a picture unless it's been edited and faceteduned and filtered, Selma is choosing to share the raw truth."

Despite largely staying out of the spotlight, Blair has been documenting her MS battle on Instagram for her fans. Earlier this month, she **shared a photo** of herself undergoing intravenous immunoglobulin (IVIG) treatment and also **posted a video of her in bed**, writing, "Here's a truth. I feel sick as all hell. I am vomiting and all the things which are not polite to speak of. My son ran away. From me. I have to get him to school. The medical treatments take their toll. I am going to get through this. We do. This will pass."

"I know first hand that as friends and family, we only want to help, but we can never truly understand what that person is going through. And by showing these truths, Selma is letting other people know that they are not alone and that is a true friend," Gellar said at the gala, getting emotional. "I don't think there is a stronger person that I know and I'm so proud to be her friend."

At the gala, Blair also reunited with **Kris Jenner**, who she played in the 2016 FX miniseries *American Crime Story: The People v OJ Simpson*. **The two had first met** in 2015 while the actress was preparing for the role. Jenner attended the event with partner **Corey Gamble**.

Other celebrity guests included **Jamie-Lynn Sigler** and **Jack Osbourne**, who also have MS, as well as **Camille Grammer**, **Rumer Willis**, **Lea Thompson**, **Johnny Galecki** and pregnant girlfriend **Alaina Meyer**, **LaToya Jackson**, **Avril Lavigne** and boyfriend **Phillip Sarofm**, E!'s *LadyGang* star **Keltie Knight**, **Kathy Hilton** and **Rick Hilton**, *Dancing With the Stars* pros and married couple **Maksim Chmerkovskiy** and **Peta Murgatroyd**, **Tia Carrere**, **Garcelle Beauvais** and **Constance Zimmer**.

## Selma Blair Just Addressed The Changes In Her Voice At 'Race To Erase MS' Gala

"Oh my god! Can you hear I'm talking really well?"

- Selma Blair received the "Medal of Hope" at the 26th annual Race to Erase MS gala Friday night.
- In her speech, Selma discussed her vocal issues, a.k.a., spasmodic dysphonia.
- Selma has been extremely open about her struggles with MS since being diagnosed in August 2018.

Selma Blair has been the epitome of grace since being diagnosed with multiple sclerosis in August 2018, and now the actress is being honored for being a voice for those also dealing with the disease.

Friday night, at the 26th annual Race to Erase MS gala, Selma was honored with the "Medal of Hope" award, presented to her by her best friend, Sarah Michelle Gellar, and *Good Morning America* cohost Robin Roberts.

Robin shared video from some of Selma's speech on Monday's episode of *GMA*, and it was incredibly inspirational. "I'm really happy that you are all here, that I get a chance to speak for so many people who don't get a chance to speak," Selma said, while standing next to Sarah Michelle, Robin, and her seven-year-old son Arthur.



Mid-speech, she blurted out, "Oh my god! Can you hear I'm talking really well?" And the crowd erupted into cheers and laughter. But as soon as she started speaking again, her voice began to crack: "See, now that I brought it up, it's just....seriously," Selma said, jokingly.

Selma's been dealing with vocal issues for a while now. In an interview with Roberts in February, she revealed that she has spasmodic dysphonia, which is common in MS patients and occurs when vocal cords experience sudden, involuntary movements, or spasms, which interfere with vocal sounds, per the National Institute on Deafness and Other Communication Disorders (NIDCD).

During her speech, Selma also picked Arthur up—and Sarah Michelle clearly wasn't pleased about it (mobility issues are also common with MS, and Selma needs to use a cane to maintain balance while she walks). Still, she hoisted Arthur up anyway. "You hold the cane," she told Sarah, passing off her walking stick.

Near the end of her speech, Selma revealed why she makes being vocal about her MS such a priority. "Everything is for our future...for the people who have immune diseases," she said.

Selma ended her speech on a hopeful note for her (and her son's) future: "My dream is that I get to be a useful mom, as long as this kid wants me."

### THE RACE TO ERASE MS

Nancy Davis on this year's May 10 gala

**You founded Race to Erase MS. Tell us about that.**

About 27 years ago I was diagnosed with Multiple Sclerosis (MS) and at the time there was no known cause, no cure, no drugs on the market. I was very lucky I could go get second opinions, and I went to many doctors basically hoping someone would tell me I didn't have MS. I was a young mom, with three kids, and it didn't fit into my job description for the rest of my life to just go home and go to bed -- which is basically what I was told. I was told I couldn't do anything except basically operate the remote control

for the rest of my life. And it was rather upsetting/depressing, and I was so young and full of life and wanted to accomplish so many things in my life and I was told everything was off the table at that point.

So, in going to many of the best doctors around the country, they all unfortunately did say I had MS. But when I listened to the research they were doing all over the country, they were all doing identical research as each other but were very convinced they were the only ones doing the research. So, kind of a light bulb went off in my head, and I thought gosh I have this very unpopular disease with very little hope so if we could at least put the best and the brightest together

to work as a team to never duplicate research, to constantly communicate, we will find a cure much quicker. So essentially I put something together called "The Center Without Walls" - and we've never spent a penny on mortar and bricks - we do events every year and the money that we raise goes to funding really important basic science research studies that would probably never would have gotten funded ever.

Today, very exciting, was this hopeless disease - there's now 15 drugs on the market - 12 of which we did the pilot studies for in the beginning.

We're very proud of and very excited all these things exist today that really did not exist and from doing our event Race to Erase MS so much has really changed so that young person being diagnosed today with MS, instead of being told go home and go to bed like I was told, there's so many options - there's so many different things you can do - there's different drugs, different therapies, and the true hope is that we will actually find a cure.

**Who can be affected by MS?**

At least three times as many women as men get affected by Multiple Sclerosis. It's usually in the prime of your life, in between the age of 20 and 40, when you're just sort of starting out your life

and career and everything and usually that's when it hits. It affects men too, and usually the men I know that have it have it in a much more severe way type of way. But, it could affect anybody, anywhere.

**How much has your foundation raised to fight the disease?**

I think we've raised about \$47 million. We have 7 hospitals around the country who all work as a team in our group called "The Center Without Walls." They're brilliant.

**Your upcoming Gala will take place at the Beverly Hilton. How can the public attend?**

They can call (310)440-4842 to the Race to Erase MS offices or go to [erasems.org](http://erasems.org) to buy tickets. The event is coming up May 10th. We have a really stellar lineup: Aloe Blacc singing, whose songs are just gorgeous. We have [rapper] Flo Rida, we've had him before and everybody will be dancing the whole night. It's very characteristic at our events - nobody sits down, they're all dancing the whole night. We also have an alicia + olivia by Stacey Bendet fashion show, a lot of celebrities will be in the fashion show modeling. We have a great audience and they have great electricity so we're very excited about that. Everybody will come and learn a little something about MS, which is what the whole evening is about - but the rest of the evening is about celebrating that everybody is there really helping us find a cure for MS. And it's also a really great time.

**How did your father, Marvin Davis, and your mother, Barbara Davis' phil-**

**anthropic efforts influence your life?**

I grew up knowing the importance of giving back. Both my father, Marvin Davis, and my mother, Barbara Davis, had a lot to do with lots of charities, and they started a foundation called The Barbara Davis Center for Childhood Diabetes. My little sister Dana's a juvenile diabetic, and I helped to work on that since I was very young myself. I always did the

silent auction at The Carousel Ball, and did really, really well. My father always taught us from day one, if you can give back, you do give back, no matter what. And I never second-guessed that. It was just part of what I did. And as soon as I was diagnosed with MS, I didn't question that for a minute - I knew that was what my calling in life was. I just knew I had the ability to do this and if I could I should, and I did.

**Who will be this year's Gala honorees?**

We're honoring Selma Blair and also the Hausman Family Foundation - they're really amazing people who have been generous for years.

**How long have you called Beverly Hills home?**

That's a good question. A long time. I have lived here since my son [Jason] was two, so 32 years. I have lived here a long time. But even before I moved here I came here every single year. My parents actually at one point owned the Beverly Hills Hotel, and we used to always come, even before that, every single year. I've always loved it here, it's kind of my favorite place. To live here is a dream.

I had the pleasure of interviewing Nancy Davis. Nancy founded Race to Erase MS in 1993, after she was diagnosed with Multiple Sclerosis, dedicating herself, and the organization, to the treatment and ultimate cure of the disease. All funds raised by the organization, through its iconic annual Race to Erase MS gala and year-round initiatives, support the "Center Without Walls" program, a unique collaboration of the world's leading MS research scientists currently representing Harvard, Yale, Cedars Sinai, University of Southern California, Oregon Health Science University, UC San Francisco, Johns Hopkins, and UCLA. Since 1999, Race to Erase MS has raised over \$47 million in contributions and funded MS research grants and programs totaling over \$25 million. Davis also created the annual "Orange You Happy to Erase MS" campaign, which takes place for the entire month of May (MS Awareness Month) and adds yet another branch of fundraising for MS research. Throughout the month, a variety of orange products, many of which are specially created for this initiative, are sold to benefit the cause and elevate public awareness about MS.

Thank you so much for doing this with us! Can you tell us a story about what brought you to this specific career path?

I had worked on a diabetes charity with my mom when I was diagnosed with MS. After my diagnosis, I saw how hopeless this disease was with so much duplication of research from the best MS research centers in our country. I knew if these brilliant doctors shared research, it would avoid duplication and create a dream team so we would have a fighting chance at curing MS. I knew I had to start my charity Race to Erase MS to change the odds and turn this negative into a positive.

Can you share the most interesting story that happened to you since you began leading your company?

When I was hosting my first charity event in Aspen, I had a volunteer meeting the day before, and a young woman in a wheelchair came up to me with her mom saying they heard me on the radio the night before and were inspired to get help. She had been diagnosed at the same time I had been and had young children as I did as well. She had not gotten out of bed since her diagnosis and stopped taking care of her children and living her life. I realized then that I could help others. I helped her get medical help, and her life and her children's lives were changed. I learned it only takes one story like that to give you the courage to fight for your dreams.

Can you describe how your organization is making a significant social impact?

We are working hard to find a cure for MS, and it's exciting to see how the quality of so many people's lives has dramatically improved. People diagnosed with MS now have hope that they can live a better quality of life. Every day it is becoming a reality that we will find a cure for MS.

Wow! Can you tell me a story about a particular individual who was impacted this cause?

So many people call me to tell me how they have gone from being in a wheelchair or not being able to live an independent life to then gaining their independence back. They have become active again and in some cases can walk again. Recently I meet a mom at one of the Race to Erase MS meetings at my home, and her life has significantly improved now she has access to medication we helped to develop (it received FDA approval two years ago). She can go everywhere with her children and be a full-time mom, travel and do all the things that make her life full.

Are there three things the community/society/politicians can do help you address the root of the problem you are trying to solve?

It's important to state how many people in our country truly have MS as it affects close to two million Americans. Nowadays drugs exist to improve the quality of life when living with MS and unfortunately many people have to fight so hard to get access to them. Insurance companies should make it easier to cover patients with MS and allow them to be on drugs that their doctors feel they should be on. It is so unfair that certain people do not have access to these drugs that will improve their quality of life!

How do you define "Leadership"? Can you explain what you mean or give an example?

Ultimately leadership means to lead by example. You have to believe completely in your cause and have the passion to commit to doing everything you can to reach your goals. You have to be willing to change all the time and be open to listening to all suggestions by your team.

What are your "5 things I wish someone told me when I first started" and why? Please share a story or example for each.

- 1) How hard it would be
- 2) How everything written in stone means nothing
- 3) How you should look at research as a whole
- 4) That you need to make sure your research studies won't be shelved after getting to phase two trials and phase three studies
- 5) Things will always change

You are a person of enormous influence. If you could inspire a movement that would bring the most amount of good to the most amount of people, what would that be? You never know what your idea can trigger. :-)

If we truly want to find cures for the diseases that plague our world, I would have collaborative research for every disease and follow the Center Without Walls method to bring the best, brightest and most innovative doctors to work together as a team. They would always communicate and never duplicate research. Doctors should be able to find therapies and cures for all diseases quicker by taking out competition and encouraging collaboration.

Can you please give us your favorite "Life Lesson Quote"? Can you share how that was relevant to you in your life?

"Whether you think you can or think you can't, you are probably right."

Is there a person in the world, or in the US whom you would love to have a private breakfast or lunch with, and why? He or she might just see this, especially if we tag them. :-)

I would love to meet Anne Wojcicki. I would like to discuss our medical research methods with her as she is a dreamer with a unique vision and is willing to jump outside of the standard research box. She created 23andMe and has such a large bank of genetic testing which would be amazing to use for MS as well as for studying the causes of addiction (which is a new charitable mission I have just started).

Recently I meet a mom at one of the Race to Erase MS meetings at my home, and her life has significantly improved now she has access to medication we helped to develop (it received FDA approval two years ago). She can go everywhere with her children and be a full-time mom, travel and do all the things that make her life full.

I had the pleasure of interviewing Nancy Davis. Nancy founded Race to Erase MS in 1993, after she was diagnosed with Multiple Sclerosis, dedicating herself, and the organization, to the treatment and ultimate cure of the disease. All funds raised by the organization, through its iconic annual Race to Erase MS gala and year-round initiatives, support the "Center Without Walls" program, a unique collaboration of the world's leading MS research scientists currently representing Harvard, Yale, Cedars Sinai, University of Southern California, Oregon Health Science University, UC San Francisco, Johns Hopkins, and UCLA. Since 1999, Race to Erase MS has raised over \$47 million in contributions and funded MS research grants and programs totaling over \$25 million. Davis also created the annual "Orange You Happy to Erase MS" campaign, which takes place for the entire month of May (MS Awareness Month) and adds yet another branch of fundraising for MS research. Throughout the month, a variety of orange products, many of which are specially created for this initiative, are sold to benefit the cause and elevate public awareness about MS.

Thank you so much for doing this with us! Can you tell us a story about what brought you to this specific career path?

I had worked on a diabetes charity with my mom when I was diagnosed with MS. After my diagnosis, I saw how hopeless this disease was with so much duplication of research from the best MS research centers in our country. I knew if these brilliant doctors shared research, it would avoid duplication and create a dream team so we would have a fighting chance at curing MS. I knew I had to start my charity Race to Erase MS to change the odds and turn this negative into a positive.



Can you share the most interesting story that happened to you since you began leading your company?

When I was hosting my first charity event in Aspen, I had a volunteer meeting the day before, and a young woman in a wheelchair came up to me with her mom saying they heard me on the radio the night before and were inspired to get help. She had been diagnosed at the same time I had been and had young children as I did as well. She had not gotten out of bed since her diagnosis and stopped taking care of her children and living her life. I realized then that I could help others. I helped her get medical help, and her life and her children's lives were changed. I learned it only takes one story like that to give you the courage to fight for your dreams.

Can you describe how your organization is making a significant social impact?

We are working hard to find a cure for MS, and it's exciting to see how the quality of so many people's lives has dramatically improved. People diagnosed with MS now have hope that they can live a better quality of life. Every day it is becoming a reality that we will find a cure for MS.

So many people call me to tell me how they have gone from being in a wheelchair or not being able to live an independent life to then gaining their independence back. They have become active again and in some cases can walk again. Recently I meet a mom at one of the Race to Erase MS meetings at my home, and her life has significantly improved now she has access to medication we helped to develop (it received FDA approval two years ago). She can go everywhere with her children and be a full-time mom, travel and do all the things that make her life full.

Are there three things the community/society/politicians can do help you address the root of the problem you are trying to solve?

It's important to state how many people in our country truly have MS as it affects close to two million Americans. Nowadays drugs exist to improve the quality of life when living with MS and unfortunately many people have to fight so hard to get access to them. Insurance companies should make it easier to cover patients with MS and allow them to be on drugs that their doctors feel they should be on. It is so unfair that certain people do not have access to these drugs that will improve their quality of life!

How do you define "Leadership"? Can you explain what you mean or give an example?

Ultimately leadership means to lead by example. You have to believe completely in your cause and have the passion to commit to doing everything you can to reach your goals. You have to be willing to change all the time and be open to listening to all suggestions by your team.

If we truly want to find cures for the diseases that plague our world, I would have collaborative research for every disease and follow the Center Without Walls method to bring the best, brightest and most innovative doctors to work together as a team. They would always communicate and never duplicate research. Doctors should be able to find therapies and cures for all diseases quicker by taking out competition and encouraging collaboration.

Can you please give us your favorite "Life Lesson Quote"? Can you share how that was relevant to you in your life?

"Whether you think you can or think you can't, you are probably right."

Is there a person in the world, or in the US whom you would love to have a private breakfast or lunch with, and why? He or she might just see this, especially if we tag them. 🙌

I would love to meet Annie Wojcik. I would like to discuss our medical research methods with her as she is a dreamer with a unique vision and is willing to jump outside of the standard research box. She created 23andMe and has such a large bank of genetic testing which would be amazing to use for MS as well as for studying the causes of addiction (which is a new charitable mission I have just started).

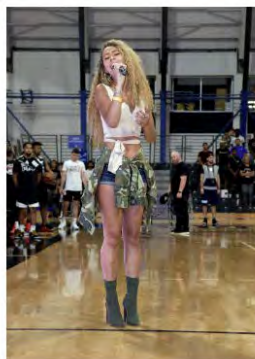

Hundreds of cheering fans were joined by NBA stars Jordan Bell, Karl Anthony Towns, Lonzo Ball and JaVale McGee on Saturday at the Walter Pyramid on the campus of California State University Long Beach to watch the First Annual Jordan Bell Celebrity Basketball Game Benefiting Race to Erase MS.

All proceeds from the game were donated to the Center Without Walls program, a coalition of leading multiple sclerosis researchers from the country's top universities, who are collaborating to find a cure and treatments for the disease.

Bell, a current member of the NBA's Minnesota Timberwolves and a Long Beach native, spoke to *The Hollywood Reporter* about why finding a cure for MS was an important and personal cause to support.

"My girlfriend was diagnosed with MS in November of last year, and obviously when someone that close to you goes through something like that, it doesn't just affect them, it affects you too," Bell said. "Seeing all of the pain and all of the stuff she was going through just made me want to just do my part. Obviously, I can't come up with a cure, but I can do my part and put on my charity game."

Prior to the game's tipoff, the audience was treated to hip-hop music blaring over the speakers as MC DJ Slice also hyped up fans. Meanwhile, Bell tossed water bottles and basketballs to the crowd, which included a group of kids from the Boys and Girls Club of Long Beach, who were excited to be close to their favorite NBA players.

During the event, Nancy Davis, founder of Race to Erase MS, explained the importance of the hard work Bell did to benefit the organization.

"He is very passionate about doing this every year and he wants to help find the cause and cure for multiple sclerosis and I admire that someone who's 24 years old, who is starting his great NBA career is so focused on really helping this charity," Davis told *THR*. "He's so giving and he just really wants to find a cure for this disease."

Before the game started, Bell also took to the mic to address the crowd and he became emotional while discussing his struggle and frustration over not being able to do more to help his girlfriend. At one point, his mother came out to support him and the entire crowd cheered him on as he tried to complete his speech.

"One of the really interesting things about doing an athletic event when you have MS is to remain athletic; doing sports, moving constantly in whatever way you can. Some people think, 'Well, that sounds so cruel,' but it's quite the opposite. The most important thing you can do is to try to move in whatever capacity you can and be as athletic as you can. It really helps keep the muscle memory going when you're having problems with MS," he explained.

The charity game proved to be just as fun as it was about winning, with players throwing down alley-oops, hitting 3-point shots and even taking some midgame dance breaks. In between quarters, fans had a chance to win raffle prizes such as an iPad mini.

The game's final score saw the White team top the Black team after securing 136 points. Lonzo Ball's manager Darren Moore was named the game's MVP after he went off for 50 points and 21 rebounds.
