

Nancy Davis Dedicates 'Drive-In to Erase MS' Gala to Late Son Jason Davis

The annual Race to Erase MS Gala looked quite a bit different this year. In light of the coronavirus pandemic, the organization pivoted to a new model and hosted the "Drive-In to Erase MS" on Friday night at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena.

But even with the change of venue, the trademark orange carpet remained. Instead of walking the carpet, guests like **Anne Heche**, **Lucy Hale**, **Loni Love**, **Maureen McCormick**, **Jovan Adepo** and **Mark-Paul Gosselaar** drove over it and posed in, on and around their vehicles.

In keeping with COVID-19 protocols, guests were asked to enjoy the event from inside their vehicles and encouraged to honk their horns and flash their high-beams in applause, while parked six feet apart. Gift bags included hand sanitizer and orange Race to Erase MS-branded face masks, while dinner was catered by Craig's and delivered in to-go style lunchboxes. Large inflatable screens were positioned around the field to make sure that everyone could have a view of the stage.

"This event is nothing short of a miracle. The past six months have been challenging for all of us, but this is exactly why we're here tonight, to persevere in an unprecedented time and bring us one step closer to erasing MS," Nancy Davis said.

Davis, who founded the organization in 1993 after she was diagnosed with MS, thanked guests for coming to the reimagined event, which was dedicated to the memory of her son Jason, who died in February. He was 35.

"I'm so proud tonight to be able to honor my beautiful son Jason Davis, the most caring and deserving person, for the Medal of Hope award," Davis said. "I know he's here in spirit, sitting here on my shoulder, giving me the strength to get through this."

After a touching tribute video for Jason, Davis and her daughters **Isabella** and **Mariella Rickel** accepted the posthumous honor.

"Jason, it truly has been a roller coaster these last six months, but I will continue to look up to you. And now I will not only continue to fight for our mom and everyone with MS, but I will do it for you, just like you had for the last 27 years," Mariella Rickel said.

"When I think of Jason and who he was, his complete mission in life was to help others and always bring people up, not down." Isabella Rickel added. "He left the biggest stamp on this world and there will never be another Jason Davis."

During the event, <u>Red Songbird founder</u> and musician **Hilary Roberts** and **Jason Wahler** ("The Hills") also announced the Jason Davis Scholarship, intended to help an individual struggling with mental health or addiction, while battling multiple sclerosis.

"Jason Davis was a dear friend of mine," Wahler said. "I will forever miss him and the light that he brought to this world. He had so many admirable traits but one I saw closely was his abundance of love. He loved his family more than anything and he loved to help people."

For the evening's entertainment, Tommy Hilfiger unveiled a virtual presentation of his new Fall 2020 Adaptive Collection — a line of clothing specialized for people with disabilities. Then presenters **Marg Helgenberger**, **Derek Hough** and Cleveland Cavaliers star **Jordan Bell** introduced performances by **Andy Grammer**, **Eric Benét**, **Siedah Garrett** and **Matthew**. For the finale, the Davis family joined the musicians onstage for a singalong rendition of "Lean On Me," which has been a tradition at the event since its inception 27 years ago.

The event ultimately raised over \$1.4 million to benefit the Race to Erase MS and its Center Without Walls program, a collaboration of top multiple sclerosis research centers working towards finding a cure for MS.

Race to Erase MS Raises \$1.4M at Rose Bowl Drive-In Event

Rather than cancel her Race to Erase MS due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Nancy Davis raced to the Rose Bowl in Pasadena Friday night for a special reimagined version of the notable Beverly Hills gala.

Dubbed "Drive-In to Erase MS," the socially distanced event raised more than \$1.4 million to benefit Race to Erase MS and its Center Without Walls program, a collaboration of MS research centers working together to find a cure for the disease.

The event honored Nancy's son Jason Davis, who passed away in February, with a special posthumous "Medal of Hope" award. Anne Heche delivered an emotional introduction to Nancy who welcomed the crowd and then offered a tribute to her late son. The mother-son team founded the nonprofit Cure Addiction Now before Jason's passing as a way to help treat those battling substance abuse. The award was accepted by his sisters Mariella and Isabella.

In honor of Jason and the Davis family's commitment to the work, Red Songbird Foundation announced that it will present the first-ever Jason Davis Scholarship to an individual who is struggling with MS, in conjunction with substance use disorder or extreme depression.

The event also featured a virtual look at the Fall 2020 Tommy Hilfiger Adaptive Collection, a line featuring design twists that makes dressing easier for those with disabilities. Siedah Garrett, who herself manages an MS diagnosis, performed an original track, "The New Frontier: Say Their Names," and "Man in the Mirror."

Other performers included Eric Benét with "Georgy Porgy" and Andy Grammer with a set list that included "Good to Be Alive," "Honey, I'm Good," "Keep Your Head Up," "Back Home," "Fresh Eyes" and "Don't Give Up On Me." Per Race to Erase MS tradition, the evening wrapped up with a group performance of "Lean on Me," led by Garrett, Benét and Grammer.

The scholarship will award an individual with a full treatment program that addresses their mental health and addiction needs. Jason's longtime friend Matthew performed a song that they created together, rounding out a heartfelt tribute to his legacy.



Letitia Frye then hosted the energetic live auction which featured a wide variety of one-of-a-kind items including a jam session with the iconic Nile Rodgers over Zoom, a reading from Hollywood medium Tyler Henry, a mini Australian labradoodle, a private dinner for 20 at LA landmark Mr. Chow and many more.

Siedah Garrett, who herself manages an MS diagnosis, delivered a beautiful musical performance, starting with a powerful new original piece she wrote for the current times entitled "The New Frontier: Say Their Names." She also treated the crowd, who responded with cheers and honking from their cars, to a performance of what is perhaps her best-known song, "Man in the Mirror," which she co-wrote. Eric Benét brought his effortless cool to the stage and performed "Georgy Porgy" for the crowd. Derek Hough welcomed his friend Andy Grammer to the stage, who kept the car-bound crowd dancing with a set list that included some of his biggest, and most uplifting, hits including "Good To Be Alive," "Honey, I'm Good, "Keep Your Head Up," "Back Home," "Fresh Eyes," and "Don't Give Up On Me." As has become Race to Erase MS tradition, the evening concluded with a group performance of "Lean on Me," led by Garrett, Benét, and Grammer.

The Race to Erase MS was honored by the gracious design contribution of Shepard Fairey and Studio Number One to their original invite concept, which is also an exclusive limited-run graphic t-shirt. Inspired by his wife Amanda, who suffers from MS. The artist's exclusive design is meant to give hope that soon there will be a cure.



While most events in <u>Los Angeles</u> this year have either been canceled, postponed or gone virtual due to the health crisis, Race to Erase MS opted to host its annual gala as a drive-in. The organization, which is dedicated to the treatment and cure of multiple sclerosis, raised \$1.4 million on Friday night at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena, Calif.

"Dance in your cars, pop out of your sunroofs," exclaimed founder Nancy Davis from the stage early in the evening, looking out to a lineup of sports cars, convertibles and SUVs on a grassy lawn at the venue.

The crowd — which included Lucy Hale, Anne Heche, Victoria Justice, Katie Welch, Derek Hough, Mark-Paul Gosselaar and Logan Shroyer — arrived via a drive-through, a makeshift red carpet, where they posed for photographers from inside their cars.

The space was transformed into a tailgate of sorts, though everyone had to stay in their rides. Instead of potlucks or barbecues, it was catering courtesy of Craig's. The L.A. hot spot served a menu that included fried chicken sandwiches and spaghetti squash primavera in individual to-go, paper boxes.

"Honk your horns, flash your lights," continued Davis, who started the organization in 1993 after being diagnosed with the disease.

And they did, all evening. As music played, guests leaned out of their car windows, swaying and singing.

"You got super dressed up in your cars for this," said headliner Andy Grammer, guitar in hand as he addressed the crowd. While some were in T-shirts and lightweight dresses, others wore gowns and suits, despite the summer heat. The day's temperature had reached 99 degrees, and by nightfall, it dropped to about 80 degrees.

But the heaviness in the air was due to more than just the weather.

"Breonna Taylor, George Floyd, say their names," said performer Siedah Garrett when she took the microphone. Singer-songwriter Eric Benét, who followed, also used the opportunity to spotlight the Black Lives Matter movement, sporting a T-shirt with the words "Defend Black Lives" written across it.

Still, the night belonged to Davis' late son Jason, who passed away earlier this year at the age of 35. "We love you, Jason," echoed family and friends, who honored him with emotional tributes throughout the evening. Though his death was ruled an accident, Davis mentioned that her son was possibly an early victim of the coronavirus.

Since COVID-19 began impacting the world, many forget about other diseases, added Davis, "diseases like MS."

"I've known Nancy for almost 30 years, she's a very close friend, and I admire all the relentless work she has done building Race to Erase MS," said Tommy Hilfiger, who watched the gala through livestream. The designer is a longtime partner of the organization. "Thanks to her persistence and commitment, countless lives have been changed and so many positive milestones have been reached."

The evening showcased Hilfiger's latest "adaptive collection," a line designed for people with disabilities.

"Inclusivity is one of the most important causes I am committed to," Hilfiger continued. "I always wanted to build a global lifestyle brand that is for everyone. The adaptive collections continue to build on that vision, empowering adults and kids with disabilities to express themselves through fashion. My son is autistic, so I have experienced firsthand the difficulties of getting dressed. Everyone deserves to feel good in their clothes and have independence."

Of the current climate, he said: "It's been a challenging time for so many people. It's made us stop to think about what really matters. As a brand, we are committed to environmental and social sustainability. Our ongoing mission is to create fashion that wastes nothing and welcomes all, and this has never been more important than today."

Nancy herself was diagnosed with MS in her early thirties. The event is usually a celebrated staple at the Beverly Hilton, but this most recent event was COVID-19 careful complete with multiple inflatable huge screens, a catered dinner by Craig's and gift bags that were put in your car when you got there, along with the orange carpet. Guests stayed in their cars and flashed their lights and honked their horns as pseudo applause.

Nancy's friend, actress Anne Heche, introduced her as "The Queen of Peace and Love" which coincidentally is the name of Nancy's successful jewelry line. The event featured a virtual Tommy Hilfiger Adaptive Collection for the Fall 2020 aimed at people with disabilities. Performers included Siedah Garrett (she also has MS) who she sang her famous Michael Jackson collaboration "Man in the Mirror," and an original song, "The New Frontier: Say Their Names." Nancy Davis Dedicates 'Drive-In to Erase MS' Gala to Late Son Jason Davis

The annual Race to Erase MS Gala looked quite a bit different this year. In light of the coronavirus pandemic, the organization pivoted to a new model and hosted the "Drive-In to Erase MS" on Friday night at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena.

But even with the change of venue, the trademark orange carpet remained. Instead of walking the carpet, guests like Anne Heche, Lucy Hale, Loni Love, Maureen McCormick, Jovan Adepo and Mark-Paul Gosselaar drove over it and posed in, on and around their vehicles.

In keeping with COVID-19 protocols, guests were asked to enjoy the event from inside their vehicles and encouraged to honk their horns and flash their high-beams in applause, while parked six feet apart. Gift bags included hand sanitizer and orange Race to Erase MS-branded face masks, while dinner was catered by Craig's and delivered in to-go style lunchboxes. Large inflatable screens were positioned around the field to make sure that everyone could have a view of the stage.

"This event is nothing short of a miracle. The past six months have been challenging for all of us, but this is exactly why we're here tonight, to persevere in an unprecedented time and bring us one step closer to erasing MS," Nancy Davis said.

Davis, who founded the organization in 1993 after she was diagnosed with MS, thanked guests for coming to the reimagined event, which was dedicated to the memory of her son Jason, who died in February. He was 35.

"I'm so proud tonight to be able to honor my beautiful son Jason Davis, the most caring and deserving person, for the Medal of Hope award," Davis said. "I know he's here in spirit, sitting here on my shoulder, giving me the strength to get through this."

After a touching tribute video for Jason, Davis and her daughters **Isabella** and **Mariella Rickel** accepted the posthumous honor.

"Jason, it truly has been a roller coaster these last six months, but I will continue to look up to you. And now I will not only continue to fight for our mom and everyone with MS, but I will do it for you, just like you had for the last 27 years," Mariella Rickel said.

"When I think of Jason and who he was, his complete mission in life was to help others and always bring people up, not down." Isabella Rickel added. "He left the biggest stamp on this world and there will never be another Jason Davis."

During the event, Red Songbird founder and musician **Hilary Roberts** and **Jason Wahler** ("The Hills") also announced the Jason Davis Scholarship, intended to help an individual struggling with mental health or addiction, while battling multiple sclerosis.

"Jason Davis was a dear friend of mine," Wahler said. "I will forever miss him and the light that he brought to this world. He had so many admirable traits but one I saw closely was his abundance of love. He loved his family more than anything and he loved to help people."

For the evening's entertainment, Tommy Hilfiger unveiled a virtual presentation of his new Fall 2020 Adaptive Collection — a line of clothing specialized for people with disabilities. Then presenters Marg Helgenberger, Derek Hough and Cleveland Cavaliers star Jordan Bell introduced performances by Andy Grammer, Eric Benét, Siedah Garrett and Matthew. For the finale, the Davis family joined the musicians onstage for a singalong rendition of "Lean On Me," which has been a tradition at the event since its inception 27 years ago.

The event ultimately raised over \$1.4 million to benefit the Race to Erase MS and its Center Without Walls program, a collaboration of top multiple sclerosis research centers working towards finding a cure for MS.

Race to Erase MS Hosts Drive-In Gala Outside Los Angeles

While most events in Los Angeles this year have either been canceled, postponed or gone virtual due to the health crisis, Race to Erase MS opted to host its annual gala as a drive-in. The organization, which is dedicated to the treatment and cure of multiple sclerosis, raised \$1.4 million on Friday night at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena, Calif.

"Dance in your cars, pop out of your sunroofs," exclaimed founder Nancy Davis from the stage early in the evening, looking out to a lineup of sports cars, convertibles and SUVs on a grassy lawn at the venue.

The crowd — which included Lucy Hale, Anne Heche, Victoria Justice, Katie Welch, Derek Hough, Mark-Paul Gosselaar and Logan Shroyer — arrived via a drive-through, a makeshift red carpet, where they posed for photographers from inside their cars.

The space was transformed into a tailgate of sorts, though everyone had to stay in their rides. Instead of potlucks or barbecues, it was catering courtesy of Craig's. The L.A. hot spot served a menu that included fried chicken sandwiches and spaghetti squash primavera in individual to-go, paper boxes.

"Honk your horns, flash your lights," continued Davis, who started the organization in 1993 after being diagnosed with the disease.

And they did, all evening. As music played, guests leaned out of their car windows, swaying and singing.

"You got super dressed up in your cars for this," said headliner Andy Grammer, guitar in hand as he addressed the crowd. While some were in T-shirts and lightweight dresses, others wore gowns and suits, despite the summer heat. The day's temperature had reached 99 degrees, and by nightfall, it dropped to about 80 degrees.

But the heaviness in the air was due to more than just the weather.

"Breonna Taylor, George Floyd, say their names," said performer Siedah Garrett when she took the microphone. Singer-songwriter Eric Benét, who followed, also used the opportunity to spotlight the Black Lives Matter movement, sporting a T-shirt with the words "Defend Black Lives" written across it.

Still, the night belonged to Davis' late son Jason, who passed away earlier this year at the age of 35. "We love you, Jason," echoed family and friends, who honored him with emotional tributes throughout the evening. Though his death was ruled an accident, Davis mentioned that her son was possibly an early victim of the coronavirus.

Since COVID-19 began impacting the world, many forget about other diseases, added Davis, "diseases like MS."

"I've known Nancy for almost 30 years, she's a very close friend, and I admire all the relentless work she has done building Race to Erase MS," said Tommy Hilfiger, who watched the gala through livestream. The designer is a longtime partner of the organization. "Thanks to her persistence and commitment, countless lives have been changed and so many positive milestones have been reached."

The evening showcased Hilfiger's latest "adaptive collection," a line designed for people with disabilities.

"Inclusivity is one of the most important causes I am committed to," Hilfiger continued. "I always wanted to build a global lifestyle brand that is for everyone. The adaptive collections continue to build on that vision, empowering adults and kids with disabilities to express themselves through fashion. My son is autistic, so I have experienced firsthand the difficulties of getting dressed. Everyone deserves to feel good in their clothes and have independence."

Of the current climate, he said: "It's been a challenging time for so many people. It's made us stop to think about what really matters. As a brand, we are committed to environmental and social sustainability. Our ongoing mission is to create fashion that wastes nothing and welcomes all, and this has never been more important than today."



The Race to Erase MS Gala is temporarily relocating to the Rose Bowl.

Race to Erase MS founder Nancy Davis announced today that due to the novel coronavirus pandemic, this year's event will be a drive-in gala held Sept. 4 at the iconic venue in Pasadena. Renamed Drive-in to Erase MS, the program will feature performances by Andy Grammer, Eric Benét, and Siedah Garrett, the latter of whom navigates life with MS. Also planned: a virtual look at the Fall 2020 Tommy Hilfiger Adaptive Collection, a line with design twists that make dressing easier for those with disabilities.

This year's gala will also feature a tribute to Nancy Davis's son, Jason Davis, who will be honored with a posthumous Medal of Hope for his lifetime contributions. The duo founded the nonprofit Cure Addiction Now before Jason passed away as a way to navigate and treat substance abuse issues.

"We are thrilled and excited to be hosting our reimagined Race to Erase MS gala as a drivein concept, providing a safe and fun evening in your car. We couldn't imagine not putting on this legendary event, which raises life-saving funds and awareness as we continue to work toward finding a cure for MS," said Davis. "We are incredibly grateful to Tommy and our fabulous performers Andy, Eric and Siedah who will make this another gala to remember."

As large-scale gatherings are still prohibited amid the COVID-19 pandemic, many nonprofit organizations have been forced to pivot to virtual events as a way to raise crucial funds. However, some, like Charlize Theron's Africa Outreach Project, pivoted to a drive-in events as a way to give supporters and interested parties a chance to gather while still maintaining a safe social distance. Theron hosted her event last weekend, at the same time the Rose Bowl tested the drive-in format for stars of *RuPaul's Drag Race*.

All funds raised support the Center Without Walls program, a collaboration of MS research scientists currently representing Harvard, Yale, Cedars-Sinai, University of Southern California, Oregon Health Science University, UC San Francisco, Johns Hopkins and UCLA. The Race to Erase MS is also supported by the design contribution of Shepard Fairey and Studio Number One to their original invite concept, an exclusive limited-run graphic T-shirt. Inspired by his wife Amanda, who suffers from MS, Fairey's exclusive design is meant to give hope that soon there will be a cure.

All funds raised support the Center Without Walls program, a unique collaboration of the world's leading MS research scientists currently representing Harvard, Yale, Cedars Sinai, University of Southern California, Oregon Health Science University, UC San Francisco, Johns Hopkins, and UCLA.
