The 15th Annual Race to Erase MS

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Latest research on MS set for round-table discussion

National researchers aiming to erase multiple sclerosis will hold a panel discussion Saturday in Los Angeles to mark the latest scientific advances.

The Nancy Davis Center Without Walls will host a 15th annual MS Roundtable, a free public discussion with leading researchers from the University of California, San Francisco, the University of Southern California, Yale University and more.

"To me, this is the real dream team of doctors, the best and the brightest," said Nancy Davis, founder of the Nancy Davis Foundation for Multiple Sclerosis. "To me, this is magical. It's wonderful to be able to offer this to everybody."

So far, no cure has been found for the debilitating disease that affects the central nervous systems of more than 400,000 Americans.

The round-table symposium will highlight the latest research pointing toward potential cures. It also will offer support for MS patients and their families.

The symposium will follow a \$1,000-a-ticket Race to <u>Erase MS</u> celebrity gala fundraiser Friday for the Nancy Davis Foundation.

Funds will go toward the The Nancy Davis Center Without Walls program, which combines MS research from UC San Francisco, Brigham & Women's Harvard Hospital, Yale, The Cleveland Clinic, Oregon Health and Science University, Johns Hopkins University and USC.



Raise to Erase MS Event Raises \$2.1M

LOS ANGELES — This year's Race to Erase MS — the 15th anniversary gala held at the Hyatt Regency Century Plaza here — raised \$2.1 million for multiple sclerosis research through the Nancy Davis Foundation for Multiple Sclerosis.

For the 12th year in a row, Tommy Hilfiger returned to sponsor the event, which featured a performance by Frankie Valli and the Four Seasons, as well as numbers from "Dancing With the Stars" cast members and also introduced orange as the new MS awareness color.

"Hollywood has always been tremendously supportive, and it's a great way to mix this incredibly important cause with music and fashion," Hilfiger said.

As in years past, the event's highlight was a celebrity fashion show featuring Cheryl Ladd, Tara Reid, Maria Menounos, Daisy Fuentes, Terri Seymour, Disney's Aly and AJ, Kelly Hu, Lisa Rinna and Harry Hamlin.

Stars and models strutted down the runway in Hilfiger's spring collection, with more than a few of the participants hamming it up for the crowd: Rinna and Hamlin, who are husband and wife, adopted dance-inspired poses on their catwalk turn, and Ladd even struck her trademark "Charlie's Angels" pose.

Actress Teri Garr, who has MS and uses a wheelchair, was able to walk onstage to give a moving speech that brought attendees to their feet.

"It's just amazing what this foundation has done and to see what Teri has gone through," Ladd said. "I think she's a brilliant woman and amazing talent."

Other celebrities like Devon Aoki, Kristi Yamaguchi, Marlee Matlin, James Tupper, Ed McMahon, Cristián de la Fuente, Jillian Barberie and Eric Benét turned out to support the cause at the gala — themed "We [heart] to Erase MS."

Rinna joined returning auctioneer Tom Arnold for a live auction that featured luxury items including an afternoon of shopping with Paris and Nicky Hilton that went for \$11,000 and a Maltese puppy that fetched \$13,000.


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

ALMOST AS IF IT WERE A TAWDRY SECRET,

Nancy Davis professes she loves to shop. On trips to Philadelphia to film Diamonique jewelry segments for QVC, she giddily passes away downtime strolling the King of Prussia Mall.

"What girl doesn't love clothes and jewelry?" Davis asks. "I don't have much time to go out and shop, but there is something about finding that perfect thing. It's like a conquest."

Obviously, Davis, daughter of deceased oil mogul Marvin Davis, has a shopping allowance that most people would be thrilled to put toward house hunting. Her taste for Prada, Oscar de la Renta and Gucci, and hints of the high life in her Bel Air, Calif., living room — there's a picture with Dr. Phil McGraw and a gift for Garcelle Beauvais-Nilon's babies sitting in the corner — prove it.

But, as she plays with her twin daughters and dishes on fashion, it is easy to see Davis, a doting mom and passionate philanthropist who founded the Nancy Davis Foundation for Multiple Sclerosis 15 years ago after she was diagnosed with the disease, removed from the lavish surroundings. Her earnestness imbues her Peace & Love

brand and Diamonique line on QVC with a universality that's attracted a growing clientele.

"Nancy Davis — in some respects, she's a celebrity, and she has a wonderful following," says Mary Conner, vice president of jewelry merchandising at Gearys Beverly Hills, where Peace & Love's signature peace sign/heart combo pendants are the brand's bestsellers. "There is something in the collection for everyone."

The national outpouring of emotion following 9/11 spurred Davis to create the original pieces for her foundation's Race to Erase MS the following May. The jewelry caused such a stir that Saks Fifth Avenue contacted Davis in August to introduce the line. "All of a sudden, this door opened up," she recalls. "I think I've always wanted that artistic part of me to shine."





In the past several months, Peace & Love's distribution has spread substantially, with the number of doors jumping around 40 percent. The line is now available in a diverse group of retailers from Kitson to Neiman Marcus to Fortunoff. Retail prices range from \$500 to \$20,000. Davis also bowed a lower-priced QVC line made from simulated jewels, called Diamonique and costing between \$45 and \$189, nearly a year ago.

Although Davis doesn't design on a strictly seasonal basis, the Peace & Love selection has widened to many different takes on peace signs and hearts as well as other motifs, including lady bugs, crowns, elephants, four-leaf clovers and circles. And, at regular appearances at stores and on QVC, fashion tips are thrown in for free. "Wearing black really makes jewelry pop," Davis advises.

After doctors diagnosed her Nancy Davis was determined to prove otherwise. As she has, by thoroughly researching MS, writ-ing a book, Lean On Me, 10 Powerful Steps to Moving Beyond Your Diagnosis and Taking Back Your Life, and creating her Nancy Davis Center Without Walls, a national medical research founda-tion. She's established an annual weekend conference with leading scientists, doctors and clinicians scientists, doctors and clinicians that she launches with her night-hefore Race to Erase MS gala, now co-hosted by designer Tommy Häffiger, who has a family member with MS. In truth, Nancy's an out-there tycoon, even designing jewelry with monies going to the Center Without Walls, and she's a mother with 3 sear old and she's a mother with 3 year-old twins, Isabella and Marlella, with husband Ken Rickel, and three grown sons, Alexander, Brandon and Jason with former husband Bilo Zarif. Dr. Phil McGraw acknowledged Nancy's standing tall with MS, noting that she was strong enough to comfortably hold her beautiful twin daughters as she spoke to the crowd. Her late father Marvin would be proud.

Frankle Valli and the Four Seasons headlined this year's 15th Race to Brase MS dinner at the Hyatt Regency Century Plaza, and Frankie's a tiger. At 33, Nancy Davis was diagnosed with multiple sclerosis. Doctors suggested she "go to bed, forever," adding that with some luck she might be able to operate her television's remote control. Davis, daughter of Marvin and Barbara Davis, refused to accept this stark fate and committed herself to learning everything she could about the mystifying disease. She founded the Center Without Walls, funding seven hospitals and mandating that researchers "never duplicate and constantly communicate," with one common goal: to cure MS. Today, Davis leads a busy life with little time for the remote control. The mother of five, she has two successful jewelry lines, is an author and an advocate for those newly diagnosed or living with MS, and is celebrating the 15th year of her charity RACE to Erase MS, whose annual gala has raised more than \$2.5 million. Our hats are off to Davis for the tremendous contributions she's made to treating and slowing the disease.

LOS ANGELES CONFIDENTIAL: What's planned for this year's RACE to Erase event?

NANCY DAVIS: We're doing a campaign for the month of May called "Orange You Happy to Erase MS." We're selling an orange cuff bracelet and an orange T-shirt that Tommy Hilfiger is doing, and Tommy and I also designed a piece of jewelry for QVC that we'll be selling after the event.

LAC: Tell me about the Nancy Davis Center Without Walls Program.

ND: When I was diagnosed 17 years ago, there were no drugs on the market to treat MS except steroids. I went from doctor to doctor getting second opinions, and found a lot of them were doing identical research but not sharing information. So I figured if we could gather the best and brightest to work as a team, we'd have something. Today we have seven centers: Harvard, Yale, the Cleveland Clinic, USC, UC San Francisco, Oregon Health & Science University, and Johns Hopkins. They communicate monthly and come together about four times a year. Now we're on the eve of announcing FDA approval for the seventh drug to help stop the progression of MS.

LAC: You also wrote a pretty amazing book, Lean on Me.

ND: Thank you. What motivated me to write my book is that at some point in your life, you or someone you love will be diagnosed with a life-



altering disease. I get calls from some of the most brilliant, well-educated people who absolutely fall to pieces when they get diagnosed. They don't know which end is up, how to get a second opinion, or how to sort through insurance and medical coverage. My book is about becoming the CEO of your health.

LAC: You also created the My Very Necessary Medical LD.

ND: I came up with the My Very Necessary Medical LD. to keep in the front of your wallet for paramedics to find if you're in a crisis and can't speak for yourself. It's also useful for people under pressure trying to remember every medication they take and what the dosages are. You can also store MRIs, blood-test results, even your will, on your own secure, private website that comes with the service.

LAC: Do you find that being in LA helps your cause?

ND: Yes! LA is a mecca for so many great scientists, doctors, and hospitals. The celebrity community here is also amazingly generous. By lending their name or donating an auction item, they help raise a lot of money, which then goes into MS research, getting us closer to a cure.—CORA OLSON





Kristi Yamaguchi has 'Dancing' trophy in her sights

The disco-ball trophy that goes to the winner of "Dancing with the Stars" is big, glittery and, some would say, oh so tacky. But right about now it's looking like a thing of dazzling beauty to Kristi Yamaguchi, who would love to put it on display in her Alamo, Calif., home.

"It might clash with the furni-ture a little bit," she admits. "Think about it, though: It would be a great

conversation piece."

But first, Yamaguchi and her partner, Mark Ballas, need to prevail in the finals of the popular reality show, which get under way tonight. Having consistently dis-played a technical superiority since Week 1, they go into the showdown as clear favorites.

Yamaguchi's rivals for the trophy are football star Jason Taylor (teamed with Edyta Sliwinska) and film actor Cristian de la Fuente (teamed with Cheryl Burke), and she's keenly aware that she has a chance to become the show's first female champ since soap star Kelly Monaco captured the title in Season

"That just gives me more motivation to generate some girl power out there and get people to believe it can be done," says the Olympic figure-skating gold medalist. "Isn't it about time a woman won it?"

For tonight's performance show, the finalists will take the floor together and go head-to-head in a cha cha routine. They'll also per-form an "anything goes" freestyle dance. On Tuesday, the remaining two couples will repeat a favorite dance done earlier in the season.

"I'm totally excited for the freestyle routine," Yamaguchi says.

"We'll definitely be trying some different moves, and with the lifts, it could get a little treacherous. But we plan to leave everything we have on the floor and really go for it.'

Clearly, all the chorcography training and musical performance skills that helped the graceful Yamaguchi become a champion figure skater haven't hurt her during her stint on "Dancing." She also believes her skating career prepared her to deal with criticism from the show's judges who, at times, have appeared to be extra tough on her because the expectations are so high.

"I think having been in a sport where you're constantly judged has helped me a little bit, mentally," she says. "You learn to deal with the criticism and just be satisfied with doing your personal best rather than worry about your placement. That's what skating is all about.'

While the "Dancing" gig has been an amazing experience, it also has been a grueling one, requiring Yamaguchi to maintain a daily rehearsal schedule and forcing her to be separated for long stretches from her hockey-playing husband, Bret Hedican, and their two daughters, Keara, 4, and Emma, 2. She's definitely looking forward to some chill-out time.

After the show ends, her family will pack up their home in Raleigh, N.C., where Hedican has played with the Carolina Hurricanes for the past six years, and relocate permanently to what had been their second home in Alamo. (Hedican became a free agent after this past season).

Most of Yamaguchi's family, including her parents, still live in the East Bay, so she's looking forward to seeing her daughters grow

up near their relatives.
"I've been waiting since the Olympics (in '92) to get back to California," she says. "That's where my heart always has been."

As for the future, Yamaguchi is open to participating in the "Dancing with the Stars" live tour next winter and she'd like to do some televi-sion analyst work during the 2010 Winter Olympics in Vancouver, And perhaps she and Hedican might choose to expand their family.

'We haven't talked about it too much, but it's an option we've kept open," she says. "It would be fun to have a little hockey-playing boy for my husband."



"It'll be an amazing fashion show with lots of celebrities modeling – all the 'Dancing With the Stars' people...." she says. And more is being planned now. What has the author/mother of five/MS patient most excited is that by the time of the event, they'll be able to announce a new drug to treat multiple sclerosis "that's really been sponsored by the money our charity has raised." That is, Rituxan, which is already being used for treatment of non-Hodgkins lymphoma.

For MS patients, "it's an I.V. that you have once a year that has relatively few side effects. Other drugs for MS, you take daily or weekly. It should get FDA approval in four or five weeks. When we started this, there were no drugs at all to help stop the progression of MS," adds the dynamo, who refused to accept her own grim prognosis in 1991 – and went on to start her



Nancy Davis Foundation for Multiple Sclerosis in '93. This year, we'll also see orange all over Race to Erase paraphernalia – as well as used in a plethora of items by Race to Erase MS designer **Tommy Hilfiger** and others. "Certain colors have come to be associated with certain causes – red for AIDS, pink for breast cancer. We're using orange," says Nancy. "Orange is a strong good color."



Big-Ticket Items

The 15th annual Race to Erase MS benefit brought in \$2 million, with help from auction items like a round of IVF fertility treatment and a day of shopping with Nicky and Paris Hilton.

FROM LOS ANGELES Economic forecasts of doom and gloom may have cast a pall on some fund-raising efforts, but the 15th annual Race to Erase MS benefit hummed with activity—and the sweet sound of opening wallets—at the Hyatt Regency Century Plaza on Friday evening. The event, spearheaded by the socially prominent Nancy Davis and designer Tommy Hilfiger, drew a whopping 1,200 supporters, who perused a silent-auction area with nearly as many items as there were guests. The event raised the healthy sum of more than \$2 million for the Nancy Davis Center Without Walls, which supports MS research.

"We realize the economy has taken quite a turn, and there's no doubt it's impacting fund-raising across the board," said Race to Erase MS executive director Liz Zigal, who produced the event with the hands-on Davis. "We felt really blessed."

With that many items up for grabs, it's hard to break new ground, but the silent and live auctions managed to include such intriguing offerings as a round of IVF fertility treatment (the starting bid was \$7,000) and a day of shopping with Nicky and Paris Hilton (snapped up for \$13,000).

This year's event coincided with the launch of Race to Erase MS's new fund-raising campaign, "Orange You Happy to Erase MS," along the lines of the Gap's (Product) Red collection to benefit Africa. Race to Erase is raising money by selling orange-colored fashion items, such as Alexandra Knight's leather bracelets, which it unveiled and offered for sale at the gala.

Orange and white made up the decor palette: Mindy Weiss Party Consultants draped the silent-auction room in those colors, which also dominated the sparkly signage announcing auction categories. Low arrangements of coral-colored tulips and roses coupled with white roses from Mark's Garden topped tables. Davis and her three-year-old twins wore coral-colored dresses designed for the occasion by Ali Rahimi. And an orange heart embellished this year's event logo—"We Love to Erase MS"—which borrowed from New York's iconic ad campaign. Hilfiger's new book *Iconic America* inspired the logo and served as giveaways for departing guests.

Models and celebrities like Harry Hamlin and Lisa Rinna took a spin down the runway in Hilfiger's sportswear before Davis came out to address the crowd. In one moving note, Teri Garr, who has MS and had appeared on the stage of last year's gala in a wheelchair, walked to the podium after a successful year of physical therapy.

Guests sipped spirits donated by Future Brands and Barefoot Wine and dined on executive chef Manfred Lassahn's beef tenderloin and mac and cheese before settling in for a concert by another American icon, Frankie Valli. - Irene Lacher

Multiple sclerosis experts, victims hail latest advances

Five months ago, Martha Turner's multiple sclerosis had gotten so bad she thought she was going to die.

Then she found the latest drug for what once was considered a hopeless "mystery disease."

"I could feed myself. I could write. I have even been able to take steps and walk," Turner, 32, of Newport Beach, said from a wheelchair. "And I haven't been able to do that for 2 1/2 years."

Turner was among 100 people Saturday to join some of the nation's top medical researchers in celebrating advances toward arresting a debilitating disease that affects more than 350.000 Americans.

During a roundtable symposium at the Hyatt Regency Century Plaza in Los Angeles, doctors from the Nancy Davis Center Without Walls highlighted research pointing to potential cures.

They also stressed the importance of more federal funding for stem-cell and MS research.

"We can only solve MS by having science and medicine (work) together," said Dr. Stephen Hauser of the University of California, San Francisco, one of seven medical centers collaborating on MS research for the Center Without Walls.

"For the first time in history, science is showing us answers for MS."

Multiple sclerosis, which strikes twice as many women as men, can be as crippling as it can be unpredictable.

Categorized as an autoimmune disease, its mostly adult sufferers can experience numbness in their limbs, fatigue, pain, difficulty walking, loss of vision and memory, slurred speech and severe depression.

Until the past decade or so, doctors offered little

"This is kind of a dream come true," said Nancy Davis, whose Los Angeles-based foundation raised an estimated \$2.2million for MS research. "Fifteen years ago, there was nothing, no drugs on the market - period - to stop the progression of MS

"Now there are so many drugs. ... There is so much hope."

When Davis was diagnosed with MS 17 years ago, she was told she'd never walk again - that she should go home, go to bed, and operate her TV remote.

"It was devastating," she said.

No more. Fifteen years after she founded The Race to Erase MS, the mother of five is up and walking. And completely drug-free.

"We are curing MS," said Dr. Howard L. Weiner, director of the MS program at Harvard's Brigham and Women's Hospital. "But I do believe that, in five to 10 years, we may have (an ultimate) cure."

Doctors on Saturday said research is being conducted into the protection and repair of nerve "wires," called axons, through stem-cell research.

Studies are also being conducted on how genetics, chemotherapy, drug cocktails, vitamin D, pregnancy, the herpes virus and alternative therapies such as ginkgo biloba and yoga affect MS.

A chemotherapy pill called FTY720 has shown promise this year in advanced trials. And a drug known as Rituxan, approved for lymphoma cancer, has also worked well for many with MS.

Eight years ago, Turner awoke on Christmas Eve and not only couldn't walk, but couldn't feel anything from the waist down.

After being diagnosed with progressive MS, the

mother of two was soon using a wheelchair.

Rituxan, she said, has made life more bearable.

"It's just real encouraging," she said. "It works."
