

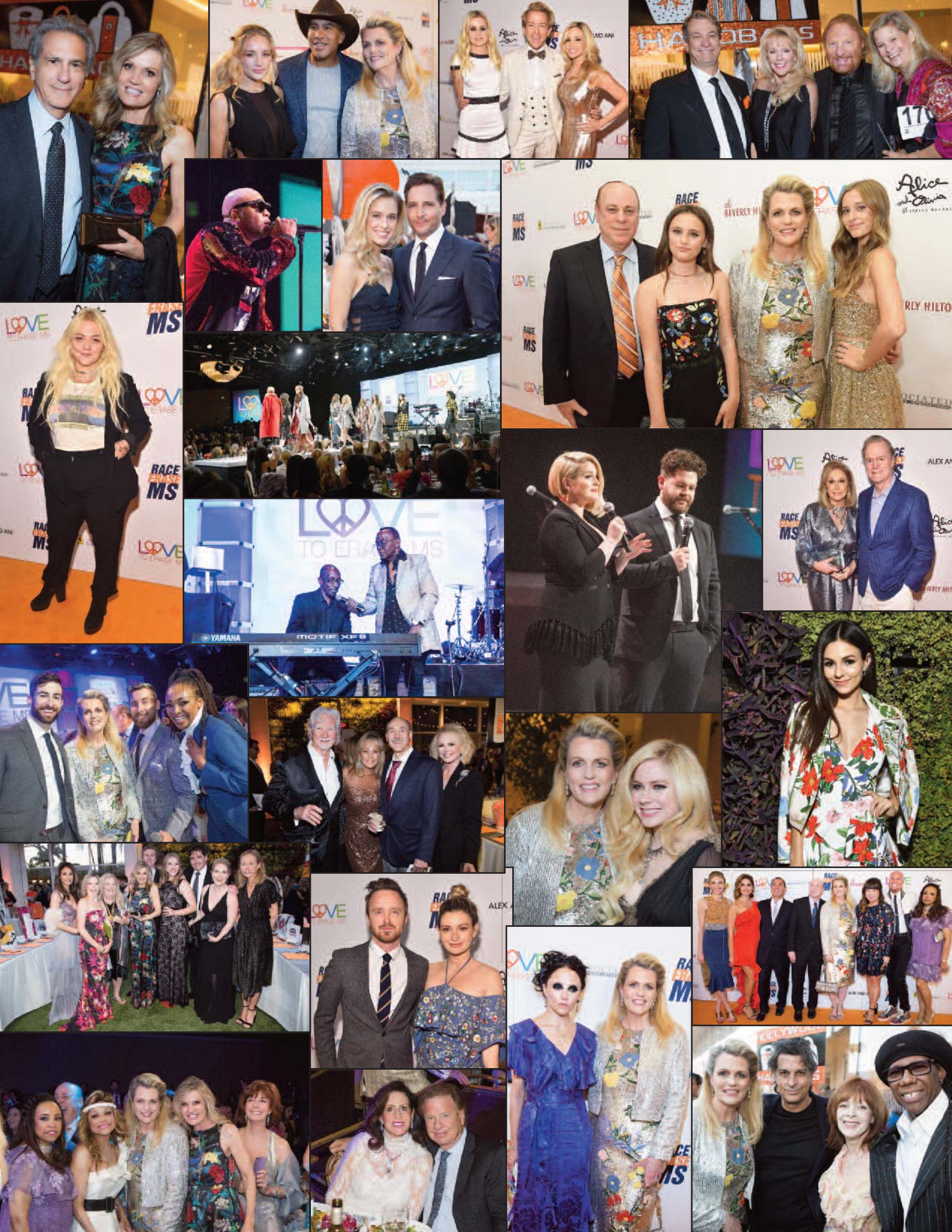

Philanthropist, designer and author are a few of the monikers that describe Nancy Davis. As Founder of Race to Erase MS, Davis responded to a personal challenge with a powerhouse philanthropic organization that funds groundbreaking research. In 1991 Davis was diagnosed with Multiple Sclerosis and told she would never walk again. The 33-year old decided she was not ready to give up and Race to Erase MS was born. Last month the organization celebrated 25-years of leading the fight against this debilitating disease at its annual gala, a star studded benefit that has raised over \$47 million for the Center Without Walls research program. "In March we received FDA approval for Ocrevus," Davis says. "This drug is administered twice a year through an infusion and is going to be a game changer for 90% of those living with MS."

Mother is another title Davis holds and treasures most. The center of Davis' world are her five children, especially 13-year old twins Mariella and Isabella who are still at home. "I became pregnant with the girls after my MS diagnosis, which was a miracle," says Davis. "My children have created a permanence in my life and inspired me to keep going because they make every day more special."

Race to Erase MS has become a family affair. Mariella and Isabella help Davis raise awareness and funds by selling and modeling her Peace & Love Jewelry line on Evine, participating in May's Orange Campaign and the We Run The Grove half marathon (Sunday, June 3rd) as well as taking an active role in the gala. "I want them to see the layers involved," Davis shares. "That way they understand what it takes to make an event come to life, plus they bring a fresh perspective to my work. Lavigne first teased the album on Christmas Day 2016 with an Instagram in which she also expressed her gratitude to those who supported her throughout her illness.

Four years after a Lyme disease diagnosis threatened to sideline her music career, Avril Lavigne is making a major return to the spotlight.

The 33-year-old Canadian rocker made her first red carpet appearance in two years on Friday at the 25th Annual Race to Erase MS Gala in Los Angeles. While there, she spoke to *Entertainment Tonight's* Lauren Zima about her present health and exciting future plans.

"I'm feeling a lot better," said Lavigne, who also sits on the board of directors for the Nancy Davis Foundation for Multiple Sclerosis. "It's been a long time for me to be able to be here, and I'm making a record right now. I have my life back, which is amazing. It's something I continue to work at every day. And [I'm] just grateful to be making music."

She went on to say that her new album, the first since her 2013 eponymous disc, will be due out shortly. "I've written a really powerful record, [a] really emotional album sort of reflecting where I am today. I'm going to release that this year. I'm actually going to be done in two weeks."

"I wanted to first thank my fans for your patience & support during my time away throughout my battle with Lyme disease over the past two years," she captioned a rainbow-hued photo of herself seated at a grand piano. "It hasn't just been a hard battle but it's also been enlightening and will reflect in my new music, artistry, life, and personally."

Speaking to *ET* on Friday, she elaborated on the new direction of her music. "I write all of my songs and I always have, and these songs are different. I'm just sort of writing about what I'm going through now."

Lavigne was first diagnosed with Lyme disease in 2014, and the star has often been candid about the toll the illness has taken on her life.

"I was bedridden for five months," she revealed to *PEOPLE* the following year. "I felt like I couldn't breathe, I couldn't talk and I couldn't move."

But gradually she made her way back to music. Last September she performed onstage for the first time in nearly three years, joining ex-husband Chad Kroeger and his band Nickelback to perform their hit single "Rockstar" at the Greek Theatre in Los Angeles.

Lavigne shared video from her cameo to social media, writing, "Impromptu performance of 'Rockstar' with @nickelback last night in Los Angeles."

"Good to be back on stage," she added. "Feeling excited, happy and grateful. #feedthemachinetour #family."

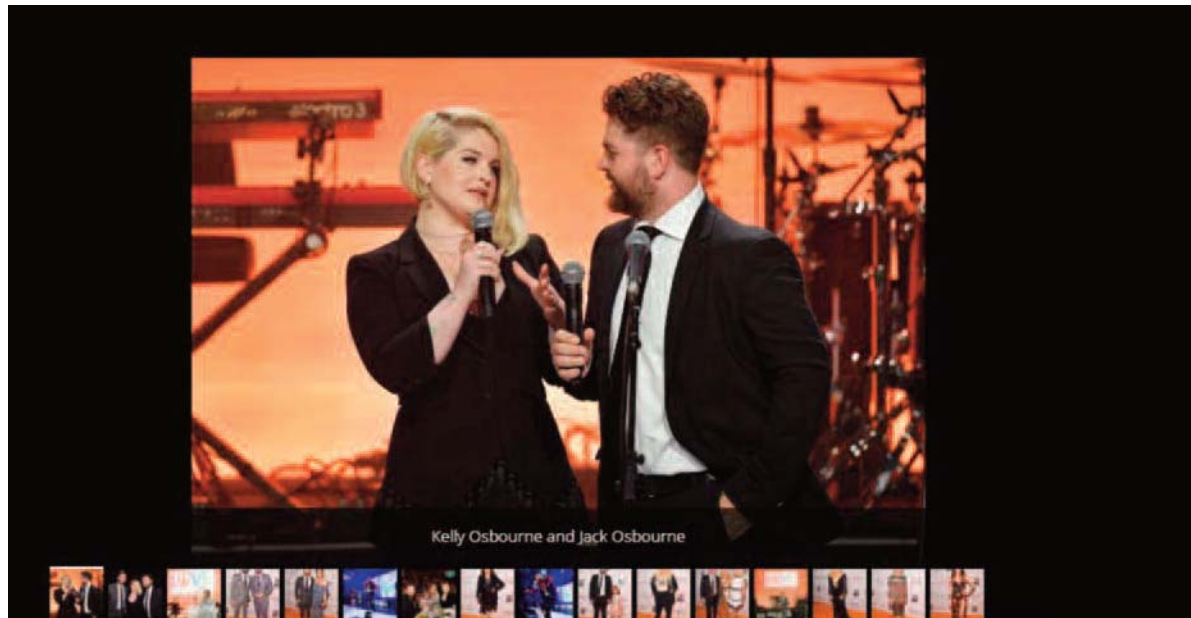
Lavigne has since been spotted stepping out with J.R. Rotem, a Los Angeles-based record producer.

This is not the first time; Alice + Olivia have backed such a gracious cause. Earlier ten percent of proceeds from sales of the line's 'Good' collection was being donated to the Good + Foundation, an organisation functioning to break the cycle of family poverty.

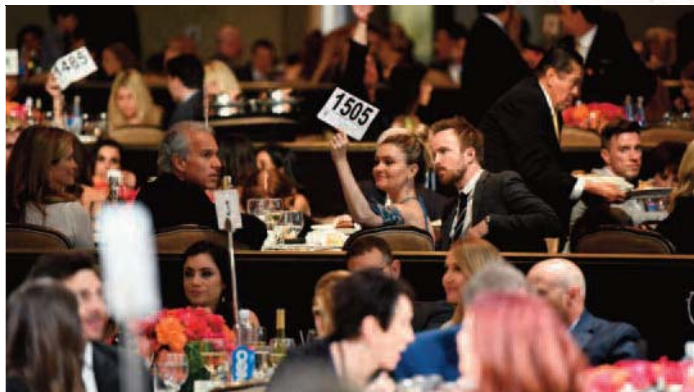

If there was one underlying theme to Friday's Race to Erase MS at the Beverly Hilton it was: if you're giving money to charity, you should get some cool stuff in exchange.

In keeping with this concept, the evening began with a massive, multi-room silent auction that opened at 6:30 pm giving guests two hours to decide if they wanted a *Curb Your Enthusiasm* walk-on role (snapped up for \$16,000); two nights at the Four Seasons Beijing (a bargain at \$500); yoga classes and even something for the proletariat: gift coupons for Pink's hot dog stand (\$25).

Race founder Nancy Davis said she wanted this year's event to be an especially big blowout because it was the organization's 25th anniversary and there was plenty to celebrate. "During that time 15 MS drugs have been put on the market," Davis said. "When we started, there was nothing, zilch. Now we're going to find a cure."

While there would be other, even more expensive stuff to bid on later in the evening, at 8:30 pm guests entered the ballroom and heard remarks from HQ Trivia game host Scott Rogowsky and Davis. Then came a full-blown fashion presentation with dozens of models showing off the Alice + Olivia collection. Seated beside the runway were Jane and Michael Eisner, who had a unique interest in the show: The company's CEO/founder Stacey Bendet is married to their son, Eric. The former Disney CEO pronounced the show, "an Academy Award-level performance."

It was at about this moment that Joan Collins exited the room. It turns out there was shrimp in her salad and the British actress has a terrible allergy to shellfish. "It could kill me," she said as she left the table where she'd been seated with Nancy's mother, Barbara Davis.

Unfortunately, that meant Collins couldn't bid on the live auction (that came right after a three song performance by Elle King) where the actress could have acquired a Pomeranian puppy for \$9,000; had dinner with Sharon, Ozzy, Kelly and Jack Osbourne at Sharon's L.A. home (Collins would easily have passed the one requirement for buying this item: "All guests must complete a background check prior to the dinner.") Plus the \$15,000 final bid would have been small change to the former *Dynasty* star. And while Byron Allen said the Ferrari Portofino that went for \$250,000 no longer fit with his lifestyle ("I've got three kids; I'm an SUV guy now," he said), Collins was made to have Italian wheels like that.

After the live auction, the auctioneer asked in a voice that modulated between shrill and eardrum splitting for 100 members of the audience to each donate \$1,000 so another \$100,000 could be raised. This seemed to go on for longer than the Oscars, but eventually the money was raised.

It was like a calming salve when Sayeda Garrett, who wrote the Michael Jackson's megahit "Man in the Mirror" came on and sang her song accompanied by a trio of back-up singers.

The night ended with a six-song set by dance rapper Flo Rida. Among those on hand were Jack and Kelly Osbourne; Avril Lavigne, Aaron Paul, Randy Jackson, Anne Heche, Victoria Justice and LaToya Jackson. The event raised \$1.6 million.

Nancy Davis is a champion. In 1991, at the age of 33, Davis—a naturally active jewelry and clothing designer, author and philanthropist who could be found skiing or practicing getting her black belt in karate on any given day—was diagnosed with multiple sclerosis. After being told by her doctors that she would be “lucky” to operate a remote control on her TV, she realized she was too young and too busy to let the disease stop her life in its tracks. She was determined to devote her time, relationships and resources to finding a cure.

Fast forward to 1993, when she created Race to Erase MS, an organization whose primary focus is to raise funds for the most cutting-edge, aggressive and promising research in an effort to find a cure for MS. She then created the Race to Erase MS Gala event. Since its inception, the Race to Erase MS has grown into a spectacular celebrity gala benefit held annually. To date, the gala event has raised over \$46 million for multiple sclerosis research. When she first started, there was no known cause, no cure, no drugs on the market, and a true lack of hope. Davis and the foundation have funded the scientific discoveries that led to the development of fifteenth drug to receive FDA approval in March of 2017 called Ocrevus.

The event even led to a future career: during the 2002 Race to Erase Gala with Tommy Hilfiger, she and the fashion designer determined to have a theme: Peace & Love to Erase MS. The event’s symbol became a heart with a peace sign nestled in the middle. She made necklaces with the symbol for performers Natalie Cole, Donna Summer and Sela Ward, which were so admired that she created the Peace & Love Jewelry by Nancy Davis line, which is carried at Saks Fifth Avenue.

In advance of this year's 25th anniversary Race to Erase MS gala on April 20, Davis sat down with *Haute Living* to share her most magical (and peaceful) spots in the City of Angels.

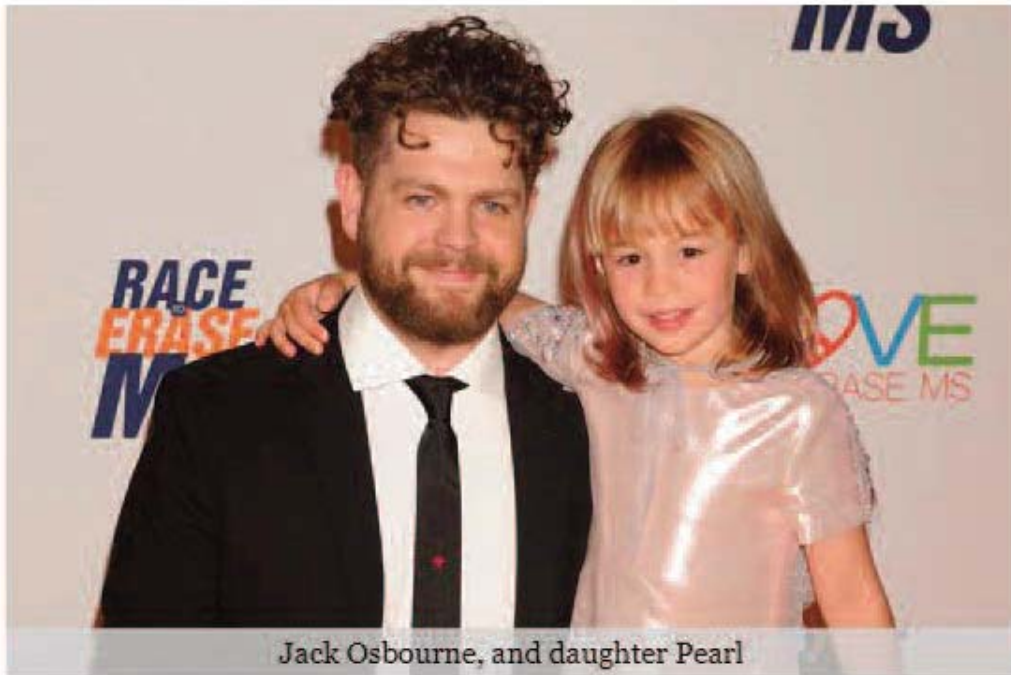

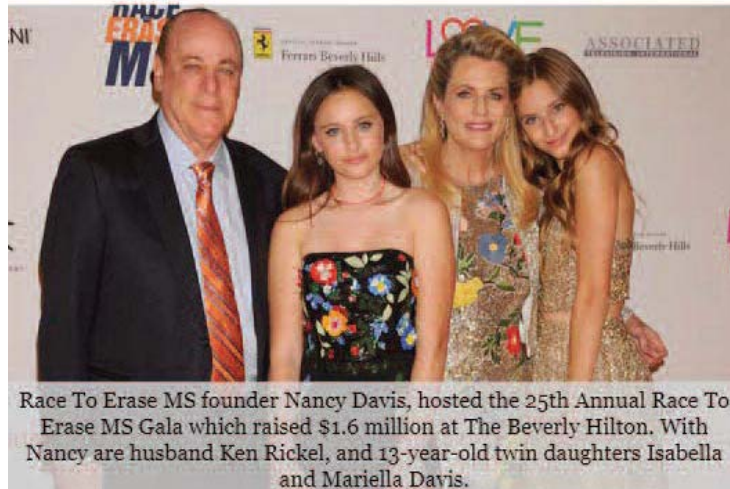

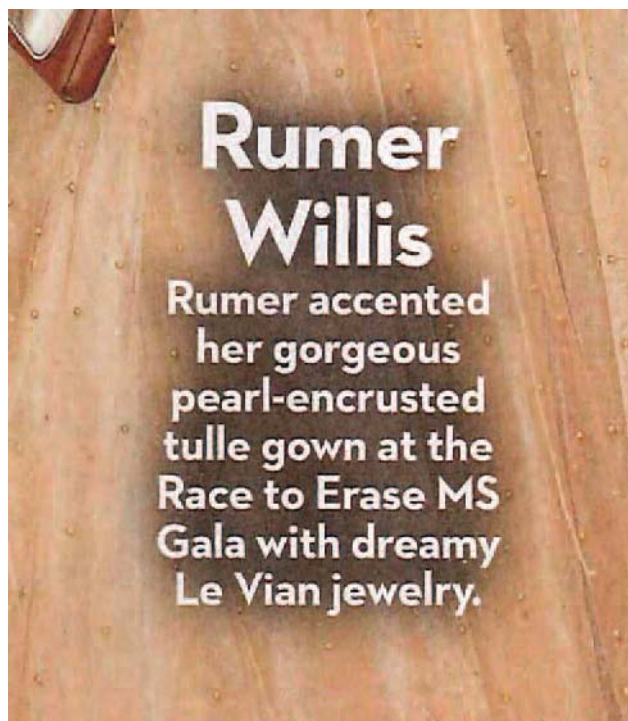

The Race is On to Beat MS: An Interview With Activist Nancy Davis

When members of the multiple sclerosis (MS) community contemplate the resounding success of the “Race to Erase MS,” they automatically think about its vibrant and determined founder: philanthropist, jewelry and clothing designer, author, wife and devoted mom of five, Nancy Davis. The 2018 event in Los Angeles — in its 25th year — raised \$1.6 million and since its inception in 1993, the Race has raised more than \$47 million overall. The organization is dedicated to treatment and an ultimate cure for MS.

The comprehensive reach of the event extends to its renowned [Center Without Walls](#) program, in which the top MS scientists from prestigious medical institutions such as Harvard, Yale, Cedars Sinai, and others conduct research and develop therapeutic approaches to treat the disease. Nancy, who also has relapsing-remitting MS, shared her contagious optimism for her work and for life in a phone interview with HealthCentral. She was at Disneyland with her children, ready to bravely board a roller coaster.

HealthCentral: Nancy, the Center Without Walls is unlike any other center for MS — any that have walls! What a truly remarkable concept. Those who attended the Center Without Walls MS [Forum](#), as part of the Race to Erase MS, had to have been exhilarated by what they saw and heard.

Nancy: Reporting on the latest research is really important to those panelists who are in the trenches. Each doctor represents a different discipline within MS research. They share a database, and come together four times a year, so they never duplicate the same research. Two or three doctors don't need to do the same study. It's critically important to share if something doesn't work. Each study then becomes a stepping stone for another doctor to build on.

When I was first diagnosed, there was no known cause, no drugs on the market, no cure, of course, and no hope. I was fortunate to get a second opinion from some of the best doctors, and a light went off in my head. What if we assembled the best and brightest in MS, but never spent any money on a building?

Now I feel we're really close to finding a cure. I feel passionate that maybe it's only a few years away.

HealthCentral: In your very educated opinion, what's been one of the most important recent breakthroughs?

Nancy: Research around cell therapy is the most important finding. Among white blood cells, B cells are responsible for antibodies and presenting foreign proteins, while T cells produce additional immune responses. We know MS attacks occur when B cells and T cells interact — B cells actually activate T cells. We used to think only T cells caused MS, and not B cells. The newer medication, Ocrevus (ocrelizumab), approved March 2017, suppresses B cells so they don't activate T cells. It's given intravenously twice a year and the side effects are pretty limited. It works in 90 percent of people newly diagnosed with relapsing MS and has some benefit in a sizable fraction of patients with progressive MS. It took 10 years for approval because standards are getting tougher and tougher.



HealthCentral: You are what some people define in 2018 as "crazy busy," but it's all good, right?

Nancy: When I was diagnosed at age 33 in 1991, I had to go the homeopathic route, and I've continued to do that. I'm doing well and I want to keep doing what I'm doing. I never smoke or drink, and ingest no toxins. I try to lead a clean, pure life. I learned early on that MS compromises the immune system, so I can't afford to do things that make me sick. Actually, I'm pretty neurotic, so I do things to keep from catching a virus. I have no real MS symptoms at the moment and I'm so incredibly grateful.

HealthCentral: It wasn't always this way, was it? As you say, in the beginning you didn't get such good news.

Nancy: I was told I'd never walk again and now I want to call that doctor and give him a piece of my mind. Doctors are gods to many people, and their messages are very powerful, particularly the prognosis a doctor gives you. I'm lucky I didn't listen and that I went the next day and got a second opinion, and then a third and then a fourth. It's your life, and you have to challenge people, because you really do have only one life to live. You can't assume anybody knows your body better than you do. I remember going to the National Institutes of Health (NIH) and one of doctors was Dr. Henry McFarland — he's now head of my Scientific Advisory Board.

You hold so much power in your hands. That's why I wrote my book, "Lean On Me, Ten Powerful Steps to Moving Beyond Your Diagnosis and Taking Back Your Life." So many people with MS never get a second opinion because they don't want to hurt their doctor's feelings.

HealthCentral: Tell us about your artistic pursuits — oh, and other Race to Erase MS events coming up soon.

Nancy: I design jewelry, called "peace & love," and sell it at SAKS (Fifth Avenue) and on evine, among other places. I've designed a special necklace and I'll be featuring it May 24 through 26 live on evine — the Loving Arc Collection — and I'll be donating a portion of sales to the Race to Erase MS. I also design T-shirts and I love doing it all. It really does let me express my creative side.

May is also the "Orange You Happy to Erase MS Campaign" with select products helping raise funds for the Center Without Walls. I want to mention the "We Run the Grove" for June 3, a 13.1 mile run and 10K/5K in Los Angeles.

HealthCentral: Thanks for sharing all the good going on for MS.

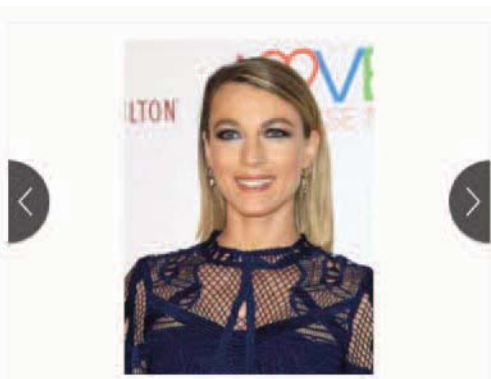
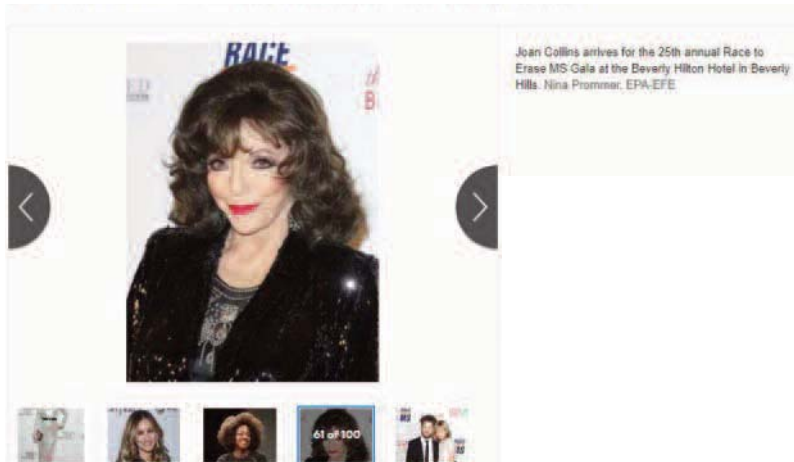

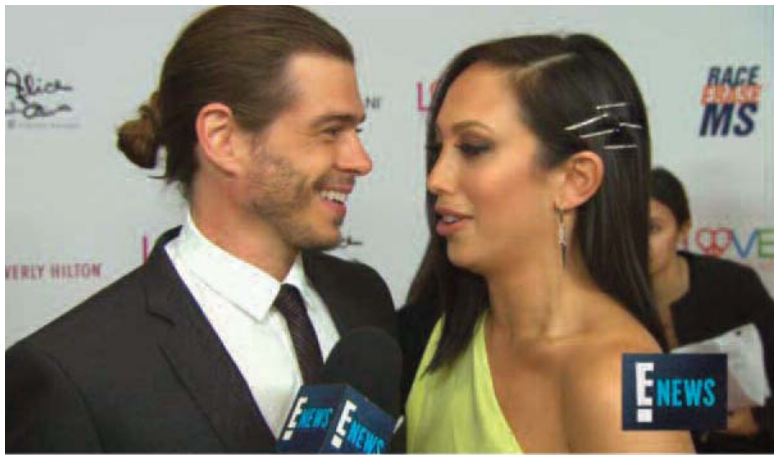

LOS ANGELES For a region that is undeniably dominated by the entertainment industry, Southern California's reputation as a home for major music and food festivals, sports tournaments, and benefits continues to grow.

New to our list of Top 100 Events this year is the Los Angeles Dodgers Foundation's Blue Diamond Ball, which, in just three years, has become a go-to benefit for the local sports and philanthropist community. Another benefit added to the list is the Elton John AIDS Foundation's Oscar-Viewing Party—while it is by no means a new event, it continues to rise above the Oscars-related chatter and become a force on its own, raising \$5.9 million in one evening this year.

Another new addition is Goldenvoice's Stagecoach Festival in Indio. While once considered simply a sister event to the massive Coachella Festival, the weekend-long event continues to break attendance numbers; it now draws 75,000 and is considered the highest-grossing country music festival in the world.

Some other notable events are absent this year, such as the Grammys and the MTV Video Music Awards, which both temporarily moved to New York in 2018. Expect to see them on the list again when they return to the West Coast in coming years. Meanwhile, the FYF Festival was canceled in early May due to low ticket sales; the high-profile Museum of Contemporary Art gala was also canceled this year for undisclosed reasons, though organizers expect it to return in 2019.

Other local events garnering national buzz are too new to make our list, including the *Los Angeles Times*' monthlong Food Bowl, the Infatuation's Instagram-friendly Eeeeeatscon, and the massive local edition of the ever-relevant Women's March. If those events continue to draw attendance and buzz, they may make their debuts on next year's list.

To choose and rank the annual events on this list, we looked at several factors, including economic impact, buzz, innovation, and an event's prominence within the communities it intends to serve.

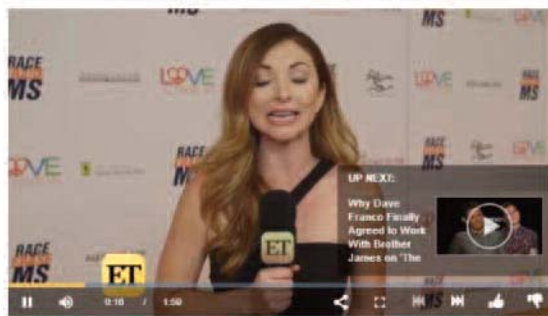

"So, it's been years. Since then, I've actually got Lyme disease, so it's actually been a few years since I've been able to make it to the gala. So tonight, I'm here and I'm feeling much better. ... All around, it's more meaningful for me to be here."

Lavigne was [diagnosed with Lyme disease in 2014](#) and was bedridden for five months. The "Sk8er Boi" singer says her long awaited new music -- which she's been working on for three years -- will reflect her life-changing journey.

Marvin Davis, now 13 years gone, at one time owned the Beverly Hills Hotel and 20th Century Fox. But his greatest legacies are his beloved widow, Barbara, who chairs the Carousel of Hope Ball every year, and their daughter, Nancy, who is now celebrating 25 years of creating the Race to Erase MS gala. What would Los Angeles (and the world) do without these ladies?

Nancy—passionate, determined, fiery, and funny—came to New York to talk about the **25th anniversary gala set for April 20th** at the Beverly Hilton. Every star is coming, not just from Hollywood but from all over the world. When all the Oscars hoopla is over, “Race to Erase” is the hottest ticket in town. Nancy revealed to me that **Pat Benatar** and husband **Neil Giraldo**—one of the great and longest lasting rock and roll couples—will perform. **Siedah Garrett**, who wrote Michael Jackson’s “Man in the Mirror,” will sing something too. Guests every year include **Quincy Jones, Clive Davis, Randy Jackson, the whole Osbourne family, Jamie Lyn Sigler**—it’s like the best pages of US Weekly come to life.

She’s also got the hottest guy anywhere—**Scott Rogowsky, host of HQ Trivia**—to host the evening.

“I called him up,” Nancy said over breakfast last week at the Rockefeller Center Cafe, “and said everyone’s obsessed with you. You have to come. We’re going to figure out a game everyone can play at the dinner.”

Listen, Nancy Davis—who has five kids and is happily married—found out at age 33 she had MS. Her doctor told her to go home and go to bed. “He said, At least I’d be able to use the TV remote,” Nancy recalled. “I said, Wait a minute. I’m only 33.”

At the time there were no drugs on the market for multiple sclerosis. None “Zero,” she says, plainly. So she started making calls. **Today, thanks to seed money from Race, there are 15 drugs to choose from.** A newer one, called Ocrevus (ocrelizumab), approved one year ago, has revolutionized many sufferers’ lives. What used to be a death sentence has now has treatments that work.

“MS is a really popular disease right now because the idea of finding a cure is out there,” Davis says. There’s a light, at least, at the end of the tunnel.

The 25th anniversary ball will not only be star studded, but look for a lot of the attendees to be wearing **the Race’s official Invictus Peace and Love watch** — a massive hit on Evie and Nancy’s own brainstorm—a great way to contribute to the charity.

But look, this is what we want to know—Didn’t Aaron Spelling model the “Dynasty” TV show with the Carrington family on the Davises? That’s what we always heard back in the 80s. In fact, when the Davises—who lived in Denver—got wind of this, they moved to Hollywood and took over. Right?

Well, not exactly. “Maybe there was an influence because of my dad’s oil company, but the characters are completely different,” Nancy says. She’s right. Marvin Davis had one wife, the amazing Barbara. There was no Alexis or Krystal. And the family—even with their own legal problems—turned out to be filmmakers (brother John), and incredible philanthropists. The Carringtons would have been lucky to be the Davises!

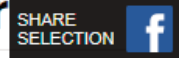

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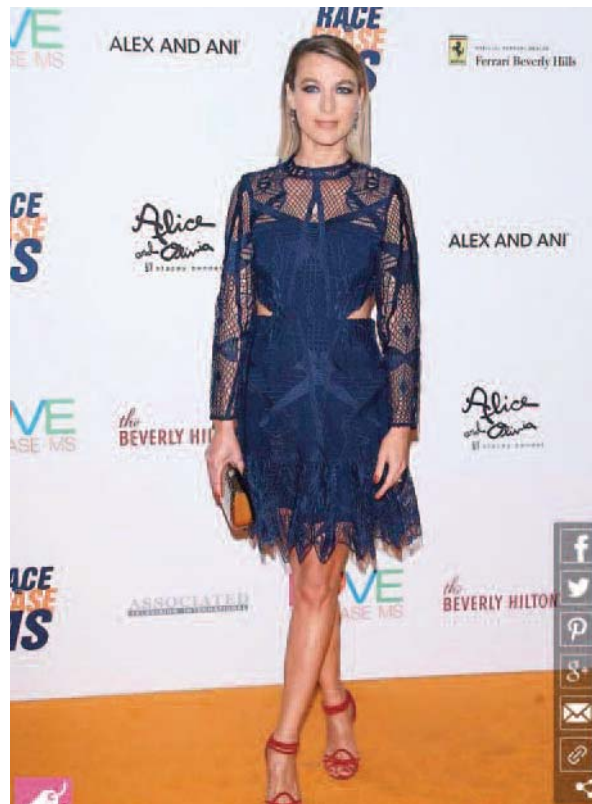
